Prior to June 1, 1964, the grade of "S" was a delayed report or a temporary mark used for graduate courses (800-900) and indicated the student had done satisfactory work but had not completed all requirements for the course. Effective June 1, 1964, the use of "S" was incorporated in the definition of an "X". Effective June 1, 1964, the definition of "S" was changed to "satisfactory". This new definition of "S" provides credit toward graduation. The grade of "U" provides neither credit nor grade points toward graduation. "S" is equivalent to a "C" or above.

Effective Spring 1991:

0000 - 0999 Preparatory course (no credit)
 1000 - 2999 Primarily for Freshmen and Sophomores
 3000 - 4999 Primarily for Juniors and Seniors
 5000 - 5999 Primarily for Graduate Students
 Only courses numbered 4000 or above are computed into the graduate GPA and allowed for graduate credit.
 6000 - 6999 College of Law, Pharmacy, or Medicine courses
