## B.A. Spanish Language-Linguistics Program Notes:

- A study abroad experience is highly recommended for the junior year and students should consider taking SPAN 3070 (Intensive Spanish

Abroad) whenever it is offered in a summer semester. Consult with an academic advisor about which programs and courses to take in the
sophomore year to prepare.

- Required courses for the major in Spanish Language-Linguistics are: SPAN 2040, 3030/3050, 3060, 3140, 3300, 4080/4090 +12 hours of
electives above SPAN 2030.
- Spanish Electives: Highly recommended electives for the language-linguistics track are SPAN 3040, 3080, 4070, 4080, and 4090. It is possible
to take one class from the following: SPPA 3160, ANTH 4775, ANTH 4785, ANTH 4795.
- Electives: Highly recommended elective for the language-linguistics track is ANTH 2000.
- Quantitative: See the ""Prerequisite and MPE Cut Score Reference Chart" on the Math Placement website for the most up-to-date math placement equivalencies: http://www.uwyo.edu/mathstats/math-placement/.
- Students may not take a course for $\mathrm{S} / \mathrm{U}$ credit to satisfy any requirement, unless the course is offered for $\mathrm{S} / \mathrm{U}$ credit only.


## University of Wyoming Requirements

Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 to graduate.

- Students must complete 42 hours of upper division (3000-level or above) coursework, 30 of which must be from the University of Wyoming.
- Courses must be taken for a single letter grade unless offered only for S/U.
- University Studies Program (USP), Human Culture (H) and Physical \& Natural World (PN) courses must be taken outside of the major subject, but can be cross-listed with the major.


## College of Arts and Sciences Requirements

- Students must take two "core" courses in addition to UW's USP requirements: Diversity in the United States (ASD) and Global Awareness (ASG).
- No more than 60 hours in the major subject may be used toward the 120 credit hours required for graduation.
- At least 30 hours in the major subject must be completed with a grade of C or better (individual majors may require more)

The University of Wyoming Office of the Registrar provides final approval of degree completion requirements prior to the awarding of any degree.
