Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 to graduate.
Students must complete 42 hours of upper division (3000-level or above) coursework, 30 of which must be from the University of Wyoming.
Courses must be taken for a letter grade unless offered only for S/U.
University Studies Program (USP) Human Culture (H) and Physical & Natural World (PN) courses must be taken outside of the major subject, but can be cross-listed with the major.

College of Arts and Sciences requirements:

Students must take two "core" courses in addition to the USP requirements: Diversity in the United States (ASD) and Global
Awareness (ASG). • No more than 60 hours in the major subject may be used toward the 120 credit hours required for
graduation. • At least 30 hours in the major subject must be completed with a grade of C or better (the major may require more).

American Indian Studies Program Notes:

Forty-two (42) hours of coursework in American Indian Studies is required for a bachelor's degree in American Indian Studies. • A grade of C must be earned in all American Indian Studies courses applied to the degree.
