Subject: Course Syllabus Requirement

Number: UW Regulation 2-117



I. PURPOSE

To establish guidelines for the development and distribution of course syllabi.

II. GENERAL INFORMATION

A syllabus makes clear the expectations and requirements the parties are expected to fulfill.

III. GUIDELINES

- **A.** The instructor of a course shall provide a copy of the course syllabus to the students at the beginning of the semester.
- **B.** The syllabus may be distributed via hard copy or by electronic means.
- **C.** The contents of a syllabus are flexible, but shall include the following:
 - 1. A description of the course, including its purpose, content, and goals;
 - 2. Meeting times and/or schedule of the course;
 - **3.** The general requirements and expectations for the course;
 - **4.** The instructor's contact information and office hours;
 - **5.** Academic dishonesty policies, with a statement or a reference to UW Regulation 6-802 "Procedures and Authorized University Actions in Cases of Student Academic Dishonesty";
 - **6.** Grading and attendance policies;
 - 7. A list of required materials, including texts, etc;
 - **8.** A statement or a reference to the University Disability Support Services website, which may be found at http://www.uwyo.edu/udss/information-for-faculty-and-staff/sample-syllabus-statement.html;

- **9.** If a USP course, include what requirement(s) it fulfills.
- **D.** Substantive changes made to the syllabus by the instructor during the semester shall be communicated in writing to the students.
- **E.** Individual colleges and departments may develop additional guidelines for course syllabi.
- **F.** An instructor's failure to comply with this regulation does not relieve a student from the responsibility to meet the academic requirements of the course as determined by the instructor.
