# Wyoming Energy Authority (WEA) Exception Funding Records Amendment

A project led by GreenOre, Columbia University, and JCOAL to develop an innovative fly ash treatment technology using Powder River Basin Coal at the Wyoming Integrated Test Center (ITC), sought funding from the WEA to conduct the research. An agreement for \$250,000 (Phase I: \$100,000 & Phase II: \$150,000) with WEA was signed in 2021 with the project partners, and Phase I of the project was completed in 2022. Requirements for Phase II funding were not met and subsequent funding was not released.



The project was approved by the Energy Resources Council in 2020, but the vote was not recorded in the minutes. For accurate documentation, a retroactive vote to approve moving forward with Phase I of the GreenOre Fly Ash Research Project was requested of the ERC.

**Motion** - Senator Anderson moved to approve the project retroactively. Dave Emery seconded the motion. The motion passed without objection.
