## A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to the western states energy and 2 environment symposium; authorizing a western states energy and environment symposium as specified; requiring the 3 University of Wyoming school of energy resources to develop 4 5 plans and funding for the symposium; authorizing legislative participation in the planning as specified; 6 requiring a report; providing appropriations; and providing 7 for an effective date. 8 9

10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

14 (a) The University of Wyoming school of energy 15 resources, with the assistance of one (1) member of the 16 Wyoming house of representatives appointed by the speaker

1 of the house, one (1) member of the Wyoming senate

2 appointed by the president of the senate, one (1) member

3 representing the energy industry, and one (1) member

4 representing general business shall develop plans and

5 funding for a western states energy and environment

6 symposium to be held in the summer or fall of 2009. The

7 school of energy shall:

9 (i) Establish a public/private partnership to

10 develop plans and funding for the western states energy and

11 environment symposium;

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13 (ii) Solicit private funding to supplement

14 public funding appropriated under this act for the western

15 states energy and environment symposium;

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17 (iii) Invite the following persons or

18 representatives to attend and participate in the western

19 states energy and environment symposium:

21 (A) Legislators and executive branch

22 members from the governments of the thirteen (13) western

23 states that are members of the council of state

limited to the national conference of state legislatures,

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- 6 (b) Legislative members assisting the school of
- 7 energy resources under subsection (a) of this section shall
- 8 receive salary and reimbursement for per diem and travel
- 9 expenses incurred in the performance of their duties, as
- 10 provided in W.S. 28-5-101.

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- 12 (c) The school of energy resources may contract with
- 13 consultants as necessary to facilitate the western states
- 14 energy and environment symposium and its purposes.

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- 16 (d) The western states energy and environment
- 17 symposium may be held within Wyoming or in any other state
- 18 that may be participating in the symposium.

- 22 (a) There is appropriated one hundred sixty thousand
- 23 dollars (\$160,000.00) from the general fund to the
- 24 University of Wyoming school of energy resources. This

appropriation shall be for the period beginning with the 1

2 effective date of this act and ending December 31, 2009.

3 This appropriation shall only be expended for the purpose

4 of providing the staffing, technical support, including

5 contracting with consultants as necessary, and costs of

planning and conducting the western states energy 6

environment symposium authorized under section 1 of this 7

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, this 8

9 appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any

10 other purpose and any unexpended, unobligated

11 remaining from this appropriation shall revert as provided

by law on December 31, 2009. 12

14 (b) There is appropriated ninety thousand dollars

(\$90,000.00) from the general fund to the legislative 15

service office. This appropriation shall be for the period 16

17 beginning with the effective date of this act and ending

December 31, 2009. Notwithstanding any other provision of 18

law, this appropriation shall not be transferred or 19

expended for any other purpose and 20 any unexpended,

21 unobligated funds remaining from this appropriation shall

22 revert as provided by law on December 31, 2009. This

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23 appropriation shall be used for:

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(i) Salary and per diem expenses of legislative 1

2 members appointed pursuant to subsection (a) of this

3 section for the performance of their duties under this act;

4

5 (ii) Payment of the actual expenses of Wyoming

legislators who attend the western states energy 6

7 environment symposium in the summer or fall of 2009.

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Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon 9

completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 10

as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the 11 Wyoming

7

Constitution. 12
