Key Reports and Updates

Faculty Senate

 Chair Godby encouraged collaboration and welcomed concerns from Staff Senate about Faculty Senate.

President's Office

- UW is in a **presidential transition year**; Pres. Seidel remains committed through the end of the fiscal year.
- State of the University Speech: Sept. 16.
- Focus areas: student/faculty/staff success, campus culture, capital campaign, and legislative/community engagement.
- Town halls are being planned for campus constituents.
- No updates on vacant leadership positions but acknowledged as a priority.

General Counsel

- Campus Priorities: Enrollment growth, budget/resource shortfalls.
- Policy work underway:
 - Student Death
 - o Protest Demonstration policy (in partnership with Free Speech Liaison)
 - Compliance with new state laws (e.g., Gun-Free Zones, "What is a Woman," Compelled Speech)
 - Foreign Influence risk (FIRST committee)
 - o Civil Rights cases: Kappa Kappa Gamma, The PhD Project
 - Updating nondiscrimination/harassment policies; case management system being developed.

- Upcoming policy updates to watch for:
 - Travel
 - o Remote Work
 - Asbestos
 - o Film
 - Direct Charges on Special Projects
- Question raised: Drone and tech compliance under Section 889—response pending.

Student Affairs

- Welcoming new Dean of Students Tyler Crisman to campus
- Preparing for **Saddle Up** (starting after Aug. 15 move-in).
- Initial retention data looks promising.
- Disability Support Services emphasized staff referrals and shared their easy 3-step student registration process. They also support event accessibility (e.g., ASL interpreters).

Budget & Finance

- Student Fee Book updates expected mid-August.
- 9 budget exception requests submitted—top priority: additional compensation.
