## **EXTERNAL RELATIONS REPORT**

- A. Faculty Senate Chairman, Ray Fertig, III
  - a. Faculty Senate is focused on the USP proposal and faculty response, clarification of faculty/student recruitment definitions, and new degree program evaluation.
  - b. School of Computing moving to its own school vote in March.

### ADMINISTRATION REPORTS

- A. President's Office Megan Levin, Administrative Operations Manager
  - a. The President will hold a Staff Town Hall on February 19 from 4:00 5:00 pm in the Union West Ball Room. Questions may be submitted by February 14<sup>th</sup>.
  - b. Staff will receive 2.5 hours of release time for Staff Recognition Day.
  - c. Enrollment for the spring semester showed 93% of fall first time students have returned for spring semester, and we welcomed 360 new students.
  - d. Athletics is giving away free tickets to staff for the March 5th basketball game.
  - e. Following the federal executive orders, plan for clear and broad communication and is strongly advocating for UW.
- B. General Counsel VP Tara Evans
  - a. General Counsel is following state legislation and federal mandates which include:
    - i. The concealed carry bill has progressed. They did carve out open carry as an amendment which if passed, UW could regulate.
    - ii. Three DEI bills, one of which pertains to what you can/cannot require a course on certain topics that show prejudice to American contemporary society. UW stands up for academic freedom and freedom of expression.
    - iii. President Trump's rescindment of Biden's executive orders and institution of thirty-five new executive orders which may include no federal funding for certain aspects such as DEI, climate, birthright citizenship, radical truth, environmental justice, etc.
  - b. UW has an Access and Engagement working group that will help refocus on the former DEI rules/regulations.

c. There is a bill that would change UW's Board of Trustees to be partially elected seats as well as appointed seats and the number of seats. We currently have an all-appointed board.

# C. Division of Operations – VP Mike Samp

- a. Residence halls are on track to open on schedule. Final design for the grounds will be forthcoming. One older dorm will be maintained for overflow. No parking spaces for the new residence halls are planned; eventually a 5-tier parking garage where the old UW police station was (long range plan).
- b. 15th Street will not open until the residence dorms open due to construction staging.
- c. The natatorium (aquatic center) is in process and will be a standalone building as far as energy resources.
- d. New flat plate going into the Science Initiative Building (building hardening feature).
- e. Finishing with the boiler installation in the west facility plant.
- f. Logistical concerns with stadium construction have resulted in a temporarily blocked portion of an adjoining parking lot.
- g. Asbestos abatement supplemental funding available slated for larger projects (not individual offices).

# D. Division of Budget and Finance – VP Aaron Courtney

- a. Move-in-day volunteers needed mid-August.
- b. FY26 budget planning is in progress.
  - i. Offering open lab sessions on Wednesdays 3:00-4:00 for assistance.
  - i. March 3, 2025 budgets due to Budget Office.
  - ii. March 10 April 4 budget review with colleges.
  - iii. April 7-11 President reviews.
  - iv. April 15 President submits budget to Board of Trustees.
  - v. May 12-13 Board of Trustee's budget committee hearings.
  - vi. Expectations is to add 10% to utilities.
- c. Expected slight increase in tuition; enrollment is steady but not growing.
- d. Expected steady growth in graduate enrollments.
- e. Submitted fringe rates for FY26 are Faculty 40.2%, Staff 44.7%, Non-benefitted 3.6% (not approved yet).
- f. Watching state appropriations.

# E. Human Resources – VP Bob Link

- a. New employees must complete the first section of their I-9s by the end of their first day (which can be done online), they then have three days to bring in their appropriate supporting documents.
- b. Back dating a hire is discouraged.
- c. IT security stay vigilant, informed, and aware.
- d. Employee Assistance Program (EAP) is ready and available. The benefits office can assist personnel with getting connected with EAP.
- e. Talent team ready to support in the hiring process.
- f. Job descriptions not available online. Discussion with Class Comp recommended.
- g. Handbook review in process; will come out in as a SAP.

# F. Office of the Ombuds – Don Appiarius, Ombudsperson

- a. Anticipating a series of workshops in partnership with other departments, geared to specific audiences and topics. Accepting topic suggestions.
- b. Human Resources would direct any mandatory mediation.

# **STAFF SENATE UPDATES**

- A. Staff Senate Rules and Procedures
  - a. Minor grammatical and verbiage changes to the Staff Senate Bylaws were passed.
- B. Staff Senate will be holding a Senator Meet & Greet Friday February 28<sup>th</sup> 9am 11am. More information to come.
- C. The reinstitution of Staff Senate scholarships was discussed, and an amendment was made so that applicants need to be enrolled in one class rather than a six-credit hour course. Further discussion was tabled and will be considered at the March Staff Senate Meeting.

- A. Staff Senate President Adam Comeau
  - a. The Access and Engagement Group reviewed over 1,400 web pages to ensure compliance with the prohibited effort statement. Site authors have been contacted.
  - b. The Conflict Management Group will be meeting February 14<sup>th</sup>. The task is to find root causes of conflict in the workplace so they can work on remedial options.
  - c. Meeting with president elect Jesse Grosinger to prepare for the new year.
  - d. Office associate search continues; the first search failed but the committee is screening new applications.
  - e. President Comeau attended the Board of Trustees meeting earlier this month. There will be new trustees coming in. At the May meeting, Jesse Grosinger will be formally introduced as the incoming Staff Senate President.

### B. Treasurer – Senator Tori Henderson

a. Tori is working with Staff Senate Committee on the FY26 budgets and will meet with the Executive Committee to review.

# C. Recognition Committee – Senator Frankie Vogt

- a. Staff Recognition Day (SRD) will be held on Monday April 7<sup>th</sup> at Arena Auditorium (AA) from 12:00 2:00 PM. This year our theme is Recognition Roundup.
- b. President Seidel has graciously approved 2.5 hours of release time for Staff to attend SRD.
