Subject: Winter Storm Expected to Hit Tonight

Dear Students,

The National Weather Service has issued a winter storm warning for southeast Wyoming and the western Nebraska panhandle effective from 5 p.m. today (Friday) to 8 p.m. MST Saturday.

**What to Expect**: Heavy snow -- total accumulations of 5-9 inches below 7,000 feet and over the Interstate 80 summit, with 10-14 inches over the North Laramie and Snowy Ranges.

**Where**: Higher elevations across southeastern Wyoming, including the Snowy and Laramie ranges, the foothills west of Cheyenne and the Interstate 80 summit.

Travel could be very difficult. Always check road conditions before extended travel.
