### **Gathering Stakeholder Input**

TEI hosted a series of 10 Town Hall Meetings throughout Wyoming to gather stakeholder input on the College of Education and its programs. An online survey was created to gather input from those who were unable to attend any of the meetings. To date, 149 individuals have accessed the survey, with 42 providing narrative responses. The online survey remains open through March 16, 2017. Once the survey closes, a qualitative analysis will be performed on all the feedback from all Town Hall Meetings and the online survey opportunity.

TEI is conducting a focused study of Wyoming school administrators to gather their detailed perceptions on the preparedness of novice teachers graduating from the University of Wyoming College of Education. The study will include phone interviews and a subsequent qualitative analysis.

### **Researching and Developing Proposals for Implementation**

The Research Work Groups in Sequence I, College of Education, Elementary Education, and Special Education, have begun the research protocol that will guide the development of proposals for implementation of new practices. These three groups are in the process of identifying high-performing programs for evaluation and site visits.

- To date, the College of Education Research Work Group is:
  - o evaluating currently available stakeholder input from surveys and Town Hall Meetings;
  - conducting a study of Wyoming school administrators regarding their perceptions of novice educators graduating from the University of Wyoming College of Education;
  - o evaluating candidate outcomes;
  - considering the potential benefit of centralizing the coordination of field experiences into one office at the College;
  - o considering the expansion of available field experiences across the state;
  - evaluating the potential of developing a lab where candidates could view teachers and classrooms through virtual technology; and
  - o identifying five potential programs for site visits, including at least one regional competitor.
- To date, the Elementary Education Research Work Group is:
  - o reviewing current practices in the program, including field experiences, pedagogical preparation, content preparation, coursework sequence, facilities, and integration of instructional technology;
  - evaluating the potential of revamping the seminar program including developing a set curriculum for these classes to ensure a focus on pedagogy;
  - o considering the inclusion of a course integrating science and mathematics with a STEM focus;
  - evaluated potential changes to the Areas of Concentration requirements, including elimination of these requirements and replacement with a content area minor;
  - considering changes to the selection process for mentor teachers, including the possibility of an application process;

- evaluating potential changes in compensation for mentor teachers;
- o evaluating the benefit of expansion of placement sites for field experiences;
- examining the program's assessment system;
- considering a curriculum mapping process to better define current courses and create more consistency across courses; and
- o identifying five potential programs for site visits, including at least one regional competitor.
- To date, the Special Education Research Work Group is:
  - surveying Special Education Directors throughout Wyoming to gather feedback on a variety of program options for preparation of Special Education teachers, e.g., undergraduate, dual licensure;
  - o identifying five potential programs for site visits, including at least one regional competitor; and
  - engaging with a partnership of the National Network for Educational Renewal and multiple
    universities throughout the nation seeking competitive grant through a United States
    Department of Education (USDOE) grant to support full-year student teaching residencies in
    selected partner school districts. Bank Street University College of Education (New York) is
    coordinating the development of the proposal. The Wyoming district partners are Sheridan
    County District No. 2 (Sheridan); Fremont County District No. 25 (Riverton); and Laramie County
    District No. 1 (Cheyenne).

Sequence II Research Work Groups, School Counselor Education, Early Childhood Education, and Instructional Facilitator, will begin their work in June 2017. The Sequence III Research Work Groups, Instructional Technology, Secondary Education, and Educational Leadership, will commence in Fall 2017.

As the work of the Research Work Groups progresses, additional goals, objective, strategies, and tactics will be submitted to the TEI Governing Board to be evaluated for inclusion in the TEI Strategic Plan.

### **Raising Awareness for the Initiative**

To increase awareness of the Trustees Education Initiative, its vision, mission, and goals, the TEI Executive Director:

- created and maintains an <u>online web presence for TEI</u> through the University of Wyoming web site and developed a <u>UWTEI Facebook page</u> to promote Town Hall Meetings and other events:
- provided interviews to Wyoming Public Radio;
- participates in the Wyoming School University Partnership statewide meetings; and
- participates in the Wyoming State System of Support Collaborative statewide meetings at the invitation of the State Superintendent of Education.

#### **Formalizing Organizational Structures and Processes**

The Trustees Education Initiative (TEI) has completed the following in establishing its governance structure and processes:

- established a TEI Governing Board and a Governing Board Executive Committee;
- developed and adopted a TEI <u>Vision Statement and a Mission Statement</u>;
- recruited and hired a TEI Executive Director to lead the initiative;
- recruited and hired TEI support personnel;
- engaged an evaluation expert, Marzano Research, to support the TEI Research Work Groups;

- adopted an <u>initial 2016-2020 Strategic Plan</u>, which includes: Vision; Mission; Initiative College Goals; Initiative Program Goal; Initiative Annual Budget Detail; Initiative Timeline, Milestones, and Activities; and Initiative Research Plan;
- established a 75-member Wyoming Stakeholder Feedback Group to provide feedback via surveys;
- established nine <u>TEI Research Work Groups</u>: College of Education, Elementary Education; Special Education; Early Childhood Education; Counselor Education; Educational Leadership; Secondary Education; Instructional Technology; and Instructional Facilitator; each comprised of education stakeholders throughout Wyoming;
- established a <u>TEI Coordinating Council</u> comprised of education stakeholders throughout Wyoming to evaluate and respond to proposals emerging from the Research Work Groups;
- drafted an inventory of desired expertise to be represented on at TEI National Advisory Board; and
- developed protocols, forms, and reviewer instruments to support the TEI Research Work Group proposal vetting, submission, evaluation, and disposition processes.

## **Building Partnerships for Funding and Support**

- gained funding support from The Daniels Fund, garnering the largest single award in the Fund's history;
- developed and begun implementation of a plan to gain required matching fund support from public and private funding sources;
- met with the Joint Education Committee of the Wyoming Legislature, leaders of the Wyoming Professional Teaching Standards Board, school district leaders and teachers, and the Wyoming Business Alliance to seek support for the Initiative and its mission;
- provided insights to inform the development of the Wyoming Consolidated State Plan under the Federal Every Student Succeeds Act; and
- drafted a fund development fund to garner funding support to support the work of TEI and meet the matching requirements of the Daniels fund grant.

## **Driving Toward the TEI Vision and Mission**

Based on an analysis of the College of Education's strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats (SWOT), this initial set of goals, strategies, objectives, and tactics is included in the initial version of the *TEI Strategic Plan*::

- I. The University of Wyoming will be the preferred educator preparation provider for Wyoming residents who aspire to a career in education.
- II. The University of Wyoming College of Education programs will be accessible via regional delivery or online course delivery throughout all geographic regions of Wyoming.
- III. The University of Wyoming College of Education, in partnership with school districts, will provide current, relevant field and clinical experiences (including student teaching) that prepare completers to support K-12 student success in the 21<sup>st</sup> century classroom.
- IV. The hiring practices of Wyoming school districts will demonstrate a preference for University of Wyoming College of Education completers over completers of other programs.
- V. The College of Education organizational structure and infrastructure will support candidate experiences and innovative practices emblematic of a nationally pre-eminent educator preparation provider.



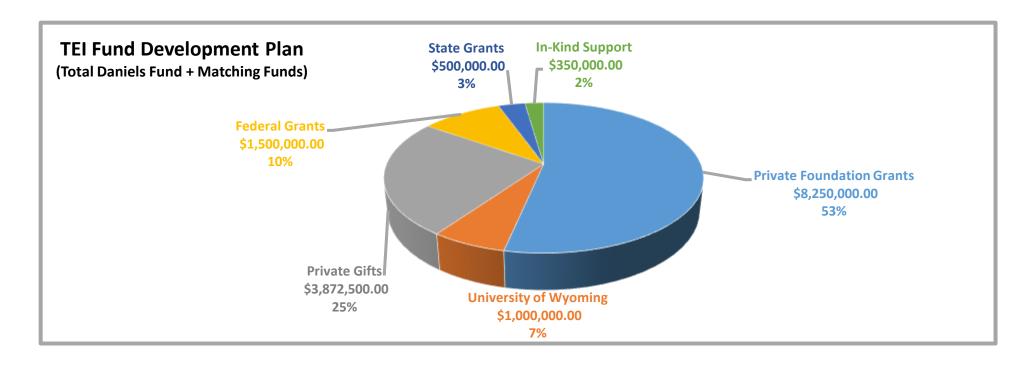
# Proposed Edits to Trustees Education Initiative (TEI) Mission Statement

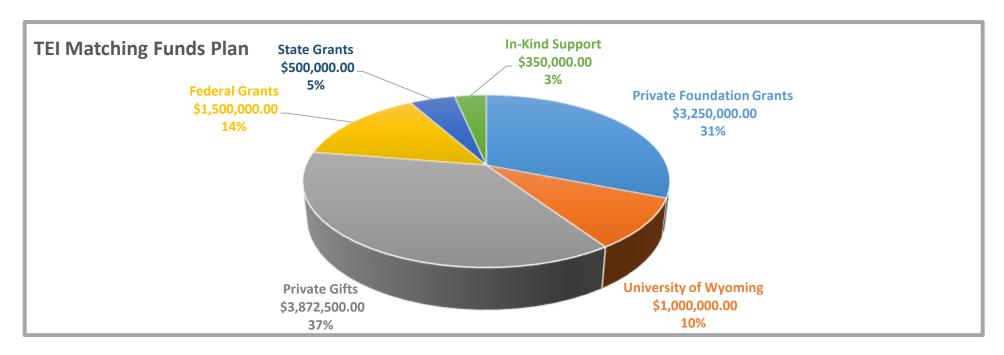
#### Mission

The TEI mission is that through extensive evaluation and adaptation of national best practices, TEI will recommend, and the College of Education will implement practices through which the College will prepare and graduate preeminent P-12 professional educators. These highly skilled P-12 teachers will spread throughout Wyoming's P-12 system, ultimately resulting in high school graduates who are among the most skilled and best educated in the nation. These high school graduates will drive Wyoming's cultural and economic engine into the future.

#### **Background:**

- The proposed edits emerged from a discussion at a TEI Coordinating Council meeting. The
  concern with having the term K-12 in the mission statement is that it excludes the work of
  the Early Childhood Research Work Group and fails to acknowledge the importance of
  foundations in early learning to students' long-term success.
- Of note, the origin of the reference to K-12 in the TEI Mission Statement is that the TEI grant from the Daniels Fund is through its K-12 Education Reform Funding Area.
