

## ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

This Articulation Agreement made as of this 7<sup>th</sup> day of May 2026.

### BETWEEN:

**BOARD OF GOVERNORS OF THE SOUTHERN ALBERTA  
INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY**, having offices at Calgary, Alberta,  
Canada ("SAIT")

and

**COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING AND PHYSICAL SCIENCES,  
UNIVERSITY OF WYOMING**, having offices at Laramie, Wyoming,  
USA ("College")

**WHEREAS** each of SAIT and College are post-secondary learning institutions offering and delivering programs of instruction in a variety of fields, including Petroleum Engineering and Mechanical Engineering.

**WHEREAS** SAIT and College desire to provide to qualified students of the other party the opportunity to pursue further studies at SAIT or College, as the case may be, upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth below.

**NOW THEREFORE**, in consideration of the mutual covenants of the parties, the parties agree as follows:

### ARTICLE 1 INTERPRETATION

#### 1.1 Definitions

In this Agreement, the following words and phrases have the respective meanings set forth below:

- (a) "Admitting Party" means the party hereto admitting or considering admitting Qualified Students to its Program;
- (b) "Agreement" means this agreement and including any schedules hereto, as the same may be revised from time to time pursuant hereto;
- (c) "Academic Year" means the academic calendar year of the parties which commences in August and ends in May of each year of the term hereof;
- (d) "Program" means, in the case of SAIT, Petroleum (or Mechanical) Engineering Technology and, in the case of College, Petroleum (or Mechanical) Engineering;
- (e) "Qualified Student" has the meaning ascribed to it in Section 2.2 below.

## **1.2 Entire Agreement**

This Agreement, including the Schedules hereto, together with any other documents to be executed and delivered pursuant hereto, constitutes the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the transactions contemplated hereby and supersedes all other prior agreements, understandings, negotiations and discussions, whether oral or written, between any of the parties in that regard and there are no warranties, representations, covenants or other agreements between the parties, except as specifically set forth herein.

## **1.3 Governing Law**

This Agreement shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Wyoming and the federal laws of the U.S. applicable therein.

**Governmental Claims.** Any actions or claims against the UW under this Agreement must be in accordance with and are controlled by the Wyoming Governmental Claims Act, **W.S. 1-39-101 et seq.** (1977) as amended.

**Sovereign Immunity.** The UW does not waive its sovereign or governmental immunity by entering into this Agreement, and fully retains all immunities and defenses provided by law with respect to any action based on or occurring as a result of this Agreement

## **1.4 References**

The division of this Agreement into Articles, Sections, and other subdivisions and the insertion of headings is for convenience of reference only and shall not affect or be utilized in the construction or interpretation of this Agreement. Unless otherwise stated, all references herein to Articles and Sections, are to those in or to this Agreement.

## **1.5 Severability**

Any Article, Section, or other subdivision or any other provision of this Agreement that is, is deemed to be, or becomes void, illegal, invalid or unenforceable shall be severable here from and ineffective to the extent of such voidability, illegality, invalidity or unenforceability, and shall not invalidate, affect or impair the remaining provisions hereof, which provisions shall be severable from any void, illegal, invalid or unenforceable Article, Section, or other subdivision or provision.

## **1.6 Waiver, Modification- Requirement of Writing**

No waiver, modification or cancellation of any provision of this Agreement or of any breach of any provision of this Agreement, shall be effective unless executed in writing. No waiver shall excuse the performance of any act other than the act specifically referred to in such waiver. No assent to or waiver of any breach of any one or more of the covenants and agreements herein contained, whether such assent or waiver be expressed or implied, shall be deemed to be taken to be a waiver of any succeeding breach.

## **1.7 Gender and Number**

Words importing the singular number only include the plural and vice versa and words importing the masculine gender include the feminine and the neuter and vice versa, where the context so provides.

## **ARTICLE 2 ARTICULATION**

### **2.1 Admission**

The Admitting Party agrees to admit to its Program Qualified Students of the other party who may apply for such admission during the Term hereof.

### **2.2 Qualifications**

A student (a "Qualified Student") will be deemed to be qualified for admission if he or she meets the requirements set forth in <https://www.uwyo.edu/admissions/international/requirements-transfer.html>

### **2.3 Application**

A Qualified Student, who wishes to apply to an Admitting Party for admission to its Program, shall apply to the Admitting Party, in the manner prescribed by the Admitting Party from time to time as communicated to the other party. The said other party shall communicate such admission policy or procedure to its Qualified Students who may wish to apply for admission to the Admitting Student's Program.

### **2.4 Admission**

Transfer credits will be granted by the Admitting Party to Qualified Students of the other party admitted to the Program of the Admitting Party in accordance with the terms of Schedule "A" attached hereto. In the event more than 75 Qualified Students apply for admission in any Academic Year to the Program of an Admitting Party, the Admitting Party shall admit the 75 Qualified Students with the best academic record in the other party's Program.

### **2.5 Insurance**

SAIT students attending UW would be required to purchase UW's international student insurance. Any UW students attending SAIT would be required to purchase SAIT's student insurance.

## **ARTICLE 3 EVALUATION**

### **3.1 Evaluation**

SAIT and College shall conduct an evaluation of the performance of this Agreement by March 31 of each year of the term hereof. This evaluation will consist of examination by the parties of:

- (a) the number of Qualified Students of each Party admitted into the other party's Program during the prior year;
- (b) the success rates of Qualified Students in the other party's Program in the prior year;
- (c) the possible or anticipated changes to courses in either the SAIT Program or the College Program;

- (d) admission procedures, timelines and special requirements; and
- (e) placement tests, fees and accreditation.

#### **ARTICLE 4 PROMOTION**

**4.1** Each party agrees to promote the Program of the other party to its prospective Qualified Students in such manner as the parties shall agree upon from time to time. Regarding such promotion, each party licenses to the other party the right, on a non-exclusive basis, during the term hereof to use the name and logo of the other party to promote to its students the Program of the other party, provided that each such use shall be subject to prior consultation between the parties and, further, any such use shall not:

- (a) contravene the other party's policy or practice as to proper use of its trademarks; or
- (b) in the opinion of the other party, damage its reputation or goodwill.

#### **ARTICLE 5 TERM**

##### **5.1 Term**

This Agreement shall commence on the date first above written and remains in force until May 31, 2031. The agreement is subject to annual review to assure currency with the respective degree requirements and may be amended at any time by mutual written agreement, affecting students from the date of the amendment forward.

##### **5.2 Termination**

Either party can terminate this Agreement:

- (a) "for convenience" at any time upon giving three (3) months prior written notice to the other party;
- (b) if the other party is in breach hereof, upon giving thirty (30) days prior written notice if the breach is not cured within such thirty (30) days period; or
- (c) immediately upon giving written notice to the other party if the other party winds-up or dissolves or its academic or required regulatory or governmental authorizations and permits enabling it to offer and deliver the College Program or the SAIT Program, as the case may be, have been cancelled or withdrawn.

In the event of the termination of this Agreement "for convenience" under Section 5.2(a), both parties acknowledge and agree that all students enrolled in the respective party's Program as at the date of the written notice of such termination shall be entitled to the benefit of this Agreement despite its termination upon their graduation from the Program so as to ensure the fulfillment of the reasonable expectations of such students.


