



Wyoming Transfer Alignment Guide (WyoTAG)

Elementary Education/Special Education' BA

This degree program leads to initial teaching licensure (leading to teaching certification), with dual credentials in elementary education (K-6) and special education (K-12).

Degree Requirements

This degree requires a minimum of 120 credits, 42 of which are upper-division credits.

University Studies Program

This degree requires that The University Studies Program 2015 requirements are met before graduation. Some of the courses required for this major fulfill USP requirements, but not all. Students should check their degree evaluations and consult with their assigned academic advisor to discuss their specific course plan.

Professional Education Requirements

The Elementary/Special Education program prepares students to seek licensure as a K-6 elementary teacher and K-12 special education teacher. A minimum of 120 credit hours is required for this degree program.

All major courses must be passed with a grade of C or better. A minimum UW cumulative GPA of 2.75 is required for most junior and senior level professional education courses, including EDEL 4500: Residency in Teaching. The College of Education requires a UW cumulative GPA of 2.75 for graduation. A minimum GPA of 2.50 in major content courses is required. A minimum of 42 credits must be upper division.

An initial background check must be completed prior to starting any field or practicum experience. Student fees cover the cost of this initial background check so work with your College of Education advisor for details.

All Professional Education requirements must be completed with a grade of C or higher.

Notes

Note 1: Students at CWC & EWC must take both EDFD 2100 and EDFD 2450 to receive credit for EDST 2450. Students at Casper and Sheridan may take EDFD 2100 + EDFD 2450 to receive credit for EDST 2450.

Note 2: At all WYCCs, EDUC 2100 is equivalent to *both* EDST 1200 + EDST 2200 at UW.

Note 3: GEOL 1070 is offered at Casper and Sheridan. Students at CWC may take either ASTR 1070 or GEOL 1070.

Note 4: Casper offers LIFE 1020. CWC and Northwest offer BIOL 1020, which is equivalent to LIFE 1020.

Note 5: Casper and Northwest offer CHEM 1090 which is equivalent to PGTS 1090. Casper, CWC and Northwest offer PHYS 1090.

Note 6: HLED 2006 at Casper College is equivalent to EDEL 2006.
