



Wyoming Transfer Alignment Guide (WyoTAG)

The BSN Completion - ReNEW (Revolutionizing Nursing Education in Wyoming) option is Wyoming's shared BSN nursing curriculum. Entry into the ReNEW option begins at a participating Wyoming community college ADN nursing program.

This degree requires a minimum of 120 credits, 42 of which are upper-division credits.

This degree requires that The University Studies Program 2015 requirements are met before graduation. Some of the courses required for this major fulfill USP requirements, but not all. Students should check their degree evaluations and consult with their assigned academic advisor to discuss their specific course plan.

Note: FYS courses have been paused. 3 hours from any additional USP designated courses is still required.

Admission

Students who apply to UW and meet university requirements are admitted to the university in the pre-nursing component of ReNEW BSN (declared PNRN). Scholastic Requirements

University and College of Health Sciences policies governing scholastic requirements (e.g. major changes, probation and dismissal) apply to students enrolled in the School of Nursing. Curriculum

The minimum UW requirement to graduate with a BSN in 120 semester hours, 42 of which must be upper division hours. Evaluation of transfer courses is required to determine credit eligibility.

The required course, NURS 4650 Pharmacology for Nurses, must be upper division (3000/4000 level). Lower division/Community College (1000/2000 level) courses do not satisfy this requirement. Transfer courses must be reviewed for acceptability.
