NARRATIVES FOR FACULTY GRANTED TENURE APPOINTMENTS WITH PROMOTION

College of Agriculture and Natural Resources

Department of Molecular Biology

Bowman, Grant R., Associate Professor

Grant Bowman (Ph.D., University of Chicago; Postdoctoral fellow, Stanford University) was appointed to the Department of Molecular Biology faculty in 2012. Dr. Bowman's research area is in bacterial cell biology, with special interests in sub-cellular organization. Specific topics include the assembly of complex macromolecular structures, chromosome segregation, and mechanisms for establishing asymmetric cell division. His teaching endeavors include an introductory molecular biology course, an upper level laboratory and scientific communications course, and the supervision of graduate and undergraduate independent research projects.

Gigley, Jason, Associate Professor

Jason P. Gigley (Ph.D., Geisel School of Medicine, Dartmouth College) was appointed to the Department of Molecular Biology faculty in 2012. Dr. Gigley is an immunologist who runs a nationally recognized and extramurally funded research lab and teaches immunology to undergraduate and graduate students. His research focuses on immune response function and vaccine and immunotherapy development for infectious diseases. He is active on several graduate student committees, faculty senate, Molecular Biology Graduate program and Microbiology steering committee.

Department of Criminal Justice & Sociology

Nov. Shiri, Associate Professor

Shiri Noy (Ph.D., Indiana University) was appointed to the Sociology faculty in 2013. Professor Noy researches global health and development and has a book and 11 refereed publications since arriving at UW. An innovative and award-winning teacher, Professor Noy offers courses at all levels, including introductory sociology, undergraduate and graduate research methods, and a study abroad course on the social and political institutions of Israel.

Department of English

Henkel, Scott, Associate Professor

Scott Henkel (Ph.D., Michigan State University) was appointed to the English faculty in 2015. Professor Henkel is an award-winning researcher at UW with one book and two refereed articles published since arrival, and another monograph in progress. Both his scholarship and teaching examine issues of democracy and resistance in the literature of the Americas. His service includes contributions to English Honors, the Wyoming Institute of Humanities Research, and the Wyoming Humanities Council.

Department of Geology & Geophysics

Grana, Dario, Associate Professor

Dario Grana (Ph.D., Stanford University) was appointed to the Geology and Geophysics faculty in 2013. Professor Grana has in geophysics has been awarded over \$2.6 million in grants while at UW as either a principal or co-principal investigator. His international award-winning research produced 17 refereed publications and speaking engagements across the U.S. and Europe. He teaches courses in calculus, rock physics, and reservoir modeling.

McElroy, Brandon J., Associate Professor

Brandon J. McElroy (Ph.D., University of Texas at Austin) was appointed to the Geology and Geophysics faculty in 2012. Professor McElroy teaches courses ranging from undergraduate physical geology to graduate level sedimentary geology and has contributed significantly to undergraduate research at UW. He has earned over \$1.4 million in grants as either a principal or co-principal investigator and has 16 refereed publications including the Best Paper of 2016 Award from the Geoscience Information Society.

Department of Modern & Classical Languages

Alexandrova, Ekaterina R., Associate Professor

Ekaterina Alexandrova (Ph.D., University of Pennsylvania) was appointed to the Modern and Classical Languages faculty in 2012. Professor Alexandrova teaches courses in French language at all levels, specializing in advanced coursework in French literature. Her research on the literature of the French Enlightenment has produced five publications and a book manuscript in progress. She has made significant service contributions to UW through her work for World Language Day, the Wyoming Institute for Humanities, and Phi Beta Kappa.

Checa-Garcia, Irene, Associate Professor

Irene Checa-Garcia (Ph.D., University of Almeria, Spain) was appointed to the Modern and Classical Languages faculty in 2012. Professor Checa-Garcia researches and teaches Spanish linguistics. She has 7 refereed publications while at the University and teaches primarily upper division courses in Spanish language and linguistics from "Spanish Conversation" to "Spanish Phonetics." She has been instrumental in creating the Linguistics Lab to promote interdisciplinary research.

Department of Music

Wu, Chi-Chen, Associate Professor

Chi-Chen Wu (D.M.A., New England Conservatory) was appointed to the Music faculty in 2012. Professor Wu is a virtuoso soloist and collaborative pianist who performs regularly world-wide and across the United States and has three commercial recordings on significant record labels. She is an award-winning teacher of applied piano, teaches weekly lessons, coordinates UW's collaborative piano program and has successfully recruited many new students to UW.

Department of Psychology

Clapp, Joshua D., Associate Professor

Joshua D Clapp (Ph.D., University at Buffalo SUNY) was appointed to the Psychology faculty in 2012. Professor Clapp is a clinical psychologist who has been awarded over \$134,000 in grants while at UW as co-principal investigator. His research on the interpersonal effects of trauma and the drivers of anxiety has produced 21 refereed publications. Professor Clapp teaches courses ranging from freshman general psychology to a graduate level sequence in statistics and currently advises 22 undergraduates and 3 graduate students.

Department of Zoology & Physiology

Navratil, Amy M., Associate Professor

Amy M. Navratil (Ph.D., Colorado State University) was appointed to the Zoology and Physiology faculty in 2011. Professor Navratil, a specialist in reproductive endocrinology, has been awarded more than \$750,000 in grant dollars and has produced 12 refereed articles during her tenure at UW. She is an award-winning teacher who offers courses at all levels from introductory physiology to specialized graduate seminars. She currently advises 30 undergraduate students and 3 graduate students.

Department of Management & Marketing

Arnette, Andrew N., Associate Professor

Andrew N. Arnette (Ph.D., Virginia Tech) joined the faculty of the Department of Management & Marketing in 2012. Professor Arnette teaches courses in decision science and supply chain management. His research focuses on issues in the areas of disaster relief, sustainability, and renewable energy. His work has been published in prestigious journals, including four publications in #1 ranked journals according to Google Scholar, and he received the Governor Geringer Award for Promising Young Scholars in 2014.

Lewellyn, Krista B., Associate Professor

Krista B. Lewellyn (Ph.D. Old Dominion University) became a faculty member of the Department of Management and Marketing in 2013. Dr. Lewellyn teaches the College of Business strategic management capstone courses for both undergraduate and on-campus MBA students. Her research situated at the intersection of strategy and international business, broadly focuses on understanding how contextual factors influence managerial action related to strategic-type decisions and subsequent organizational outcomes. Dr. Lewellyn has 15 research papers that have been published in high quality peer-reviewed journals within the strategy, management, and international business disciplines; several of which are on the prestigious Financial Times Top 50 Business Journals.

Minton, Elizabeth A., Associate Professor

Elizabeth Minton (Ph.D. University of Oregon) joined the faculty of the Department of Management and Marketing in 2014. Dr. Minton teaches the advanced marketing management COM3 course as well as the introductory marketing course. Her research is primarily focused on religion's influence on marketing and pro-social marketing (i.e., how to help consumers make good choices). She has authored 17 journal articles (11 of which are sole or lead author) as well as a book on religion's influence on marketing. Her research has appeared in such journals as the Journal of Advertising, Journal of Public Policy & Marketing, Journal of Business Research, and the Journal for the Scientific Study of Religion. Since joining the University of Wyoming, professor Minton has received multiple awards, inclusive of UW's COBAB Faculty Excellence Award and the paper of the year award at the Journal of Consumer Affairs.

School of Teacher Education

Robertson, Dana A., Associate Professor

Dana A. Robertson (Ed.D., Boston University) was appointed to the Education faculty as an Assistant Professor in 2012. Professor Robertson is Executive Director of the Literacy Research Center. He has conducted research and written on classroom discourse, comprehension instruction, struggling readers and writers, coaching, and teacher professional development related to literacy. He is a frequent presenter at national and international literacy conferences, a co-author of two books and two chapters and has published in several top-tier literacy journals. He is active in statewide engagement with schools through the Literacy Research Center, and in curriculum and standards work both within the college and at the national level. He holds leadership positions in literacy organizations both statewide and nationally.

College of Engineering and Applied Science

Department of Chemical Engineering

Li, Dongmei, Associate Professor

Dongmei Li (Ph.D. University of Colorado at Boulder) has been with Chemical and Petroleum Engineering since 2010. As an Assistant Professor her research has been built upon years of academic and industrial background and experience, my research focuses on catalytic, functional membrane, thin film and coating material development with applications spanning liquid filtration, gas processing and biomedical sensors. Her publications include Achieving Ultra-low Pt Loading with Enhanced Activity and Durability, Dongmei Li, Shuai Tan and Shibely Saha, US Provisional Patent, filed June 10, 2016, serial number: 62/348,158.

Department of Civil & Architectural Engineering

Ahmed, Mohamed M., Associate Professor

Mohamed M. Ahmed (PhD. University of Central Florida) has been an Assistant Professor with Department of Civil and Architectural Engineering since 2013. During his career, Dr Ahmed has conducted numerous research experience in the field of transportation and traffic engineering with focus on traffic safety, including traffic safety analysis, Intelligent Transportation Systems, Connected Vehicle, Naturalistic Driving, and statistical and data mining applications in transportation engineering. He has conducted various research projects and provided technical assistance to a number of clients including the Florida Department of Transportation, the Colorado Department of Transportation, the Orlando-Orange County Expressway Authority, and the Wyoming Department of Transportation. He has co-authored several high profile scientific articles in different peer-reviewed journals, including *Accident Analysis and Prevention, Journal of Transportation Research Record, IEEE Transactions on Intelligent Transportation Systems, Transportation Safety and Security*, and *Transportation Research Part-C*.

Ng, Kam Weng, Associate Professor

Kam Weng Ng (PhD. Iowa State University) has been an Assistant Professor within the Department of Civil & Architectural Engineering since 2012. Dr Ng's research focuses on sustainable geotechnical aspects of highway and energy infrastructure, particularly foundation engineering, pavement foundation, abutment scour, soil/rock mechanics, geothermal energy, carbon sequestration, and slope engineering. An active research group is currently working on these research areas. Some highlighted research projects are 1) geothermal energy; 2) pile foundation on rock; 3) interaction of hydraulic and geotechnical processes on abutment scour; 4) mechanistic-empirical pavement design guide; 5) intelligent compaction, and 6) carbon sequestration.

Department of Civil & Architectural Engineering (cont.)

Ohara, Noriaki, Associate Professor

Noriaki Ohara (PhD. University of California, Davis) has been Assistant Professor with Civil and Architectural Engineering since 2012. His research interest include hydrologic modeling, snow hydrology and hydrometeorology. He is a member of the American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE) and Japan Society of Civil Engineers. He has been working on snow and watershed hydrology modeling for more than fifteen years through national and international research projects. A numerical algorithm for snowmelt and snow accumulation processes for very fine scale modeling (~10m grid resolution) was developed and applied to various watersheds around the world. The model solves the depth-averaged snow equations for snow depth, snow surface temperature, and snow density, with consideration of vegetation interception and terrain angles. His model is a snow component of an award-winning, Watershed Environmental Hydrology (WEHY) model.

Department of Electrical and Computer Engineering

Duan, Dongliang, Associate Professor

Dongliang Duan (PhD. Colorado State University, Fort Collins, CO) is an Assistant Professor of Electrical & Computer Engineering since 2012. His areas of expertise include applications of statistical signal processing for power system wide-area monitoring; phasor measurement unit (PMU) development and applications; cyber security enhancement for power systems; smart grid communications; energy-efficient communications; detection fusion techniques.

Department of Mechanical Engineering

Stoellinger, Michael K., Associate Professor

Michael K Stoellinger (PhD. University of Wyoming) an Assistant Professor of Mechanical Engineering since 2012. His research is focused in the areas of modeling and simulation of turbulent and reactive flows. Methods include probability density function (PDF) models for Reynolds Averaged Navier-Stokes (RANS) and Large Eddy Simulation (LES) approaches and their coupling with radiative heat transfer. Applications include premixed gaseous combustion, clean combustion concepts such as flameless combustion and oxyfuel combustion of alternative fuels, coal combustion and gasification, and soot formation in ultra rich combustion. Hybrid LES/RANS methods which allow to extend LES to high Re-number wall bounded flows are also of interest and applied to predict performance of wind turbine blades. The models and methods are implemented in in-house codes or in a open source CFD code (OpenFOAM).

Division of Social Work

Thompson-Ebanks, Valerie M., Associate Professor

Dr. Valerie Thompson-Ebanks (Ph.D., Colorado State University) joined the University of Wyoming as an Assistant Professor in August 2012. She serves as the director of the BSW program in the Division of Social Work. She has 7 publications in highly respected peer-reviewed journals and a refereed book chapter on pedagogies of disability justice. Based on student vote, Dr. Thompson-Ebanks received the Faculty as Significant Mentor Award in academic years 2016 and 2017. She primarily teaches courses on social work practice with communities and organizations, and practice in multicultural contexts to both undergraduate and graduate students.

School of Pharmacy

Brown, Travis E., Associate Professor

Travis Brown (Ph.D., Washington State University) has been a member of the School of Pharmacy and Neuroscience faculty as an Assistant Professor since August 2012. Dr. Brown has published his work from UW in 10 highly respected peer-reviewed journal publications and has made 12 national presentations. Dr. Brown has had numerous grants and is currently supported by an NIH R01 grant to study neuronal adaptations associated with drug addiction. He teaches courses in clinical toxicology and molecular neuropharmacology primarily to pharmacy and graduate students.

College of Law

Chestek, Kenneth D., Professor

Kenneth D. Chestek (J.D. cum laude University of Pittsburgh) joined the Law faculty in the summer of 2012, after practicing law for 21 years. He teaches legal writing I & II, civil pretrial litigation, and contract drafting at the College of Law, co-directs the Center for the Study of Written Advocacy, and directs the Externship Program. He has published and given lectures on a wide variety of subjects, including persuasion, teaching methods, tax exemption policy, hospitals, and the uses of computers in law offices. His current scholarly interest is in the emerging discipline of Applied Legal Storytelling, which examines the role of narrative reasoning and storytelling in how judges decide cases. Professor Chestek is one of three coauthors of a textbook for first-year courses in legal persuasion, Your Client's Story: Persuasive Legal Writing. All three authors are former Presidents of the Legal Writing Institute, and the second edition of the book will be published by Aspen in 2018.

Jackson, Darrell D., Professor

Darrell D. Jackson (J.D. George Mason University, Ph.D. University of Colorado at Boulder) joined the Law faculty in 2012, after practicing law for 14 years. He teaches criminal law, criminal procedure, criminal adjudication, critical race theory (main campus class), and directs the Prosecution Assistance Program. Dr. Jackson's research interests surround supporting historically marginalized communities as they struggle to obtain an equitable share of power within truly democratic societies. His theoretical framework is formed at the intersections of three primary disciplines: law; education; and race, cultural, or ethnic studies; and primarily utilizes critical race theory. Some of his published books include Critical Race Spatial Analysis: Mapping to Understand and Address Educational Inequity (edited with Deb Morrison and Subini Annamma) and The History and Conceptual Elements of Critical Race Theory; Handbook of Critical Race Theory in Education-Chapter 1 (with Kevin Brown).
