## Impact of UWAA efforts on Giving

Cowboy 2 Cowboy Informational Interview Program "UW alumni sharing career advice with new graduates"

We continue to make meaningful connections between alumni, and students through the Cowboy 2 Cowboy Informational Interviewer program. In this year through October 31, we have coordinated 36 sessions engaging 36 alumni with 15 students and young alumni. We are on pace to exceed 2018-19 mentorships by about 10%. We are working with the Humanities Department to connect 30 students with 10 alumni from multiple professions and industries in the spring using the technology in the career rooms in the Marian H. Rochelle Gateway Center.
