The College of Agriculture and Natural Resources will work with the College of Education, Academic Affairs, HR, and Financial Affairs on implementation, including staffing plans and budgets/budget reductions. b. Next Steps/Follow-up: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. The College Education will work with the College of Agriculture and Natural Resources, Academic Affairs, HR, and Financial Affairs on implementation, including staffing plans and budgets/budget reductions. b. At the recommendation of the Dean of the College of Education, the Provost will initiate a 2-13 process to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> i. move the Human Development and Family Sciences program to the College of Education as part of the College’s reorganization, and ii. review degree programs that will be discontinued as a product of the college reorganization. 3. <i>11-5-21: The School of CLAD will not be discontinued.
