Jason Gigley (PhD, Dartmouth Medical School) is an Associate Professor in the Department of Molecular Biology. He joined UW in 2012. Dr. Gigley runs the Gigley lab and the Gigley lab has spent the last 11 years developing a better understanding of Innate lymphoid Cell (ILC) function in infectious disease. They are exploring their involvement in the control of the obligate intracellular parasite Toxoplasma gondii (T. gondii). In the last 2 years they have developed a new direction for the lab dissecting iron homeostasis in host-parasite interactions, parasite biology, development of immunity, and disease tolerance during infection.

His expertise is in the areas of human resource management and business ethics. Most notably, in 2021 Dr. Thiel was the recipient of the Academy of Management's Organizational Behavior Division's Outstanding Practical Implications for Management award.

Department of Atmospheric Science

Murphy, Shane

Professor

Shane Murphy (PhD, California Institute of Technology) is an Associate Professor in Atmospheric Science. The Murphy research group makes novel field measurements with cutting edge instrumentation that advance the science of atmospheric chemistry, aerosols, and climate. Measurements are made from our groups' mobile laboratory and from airborne platforms. The group has two focus areas: 1.) Absorbing Aerosols and 2.) Methane and volatile organic compound (VOC) Emissions from Energy Development. Black carbon and other absorbing aerosols are thought to be the third most important post-industrial warming agent in atmosphere after carbon dioxide and methane. Despite this, there remains significant uncertainty regarding the magnitude of absorbing aerosol emissions and optical properties. The groups' field measurements reduce these uncertainties. Methane and VOC emissions from oil and gas extraction are significantly larger than inventory estimates and impact climate and air quality. The group quantifies fluxes of these species and identifies ways to reduce fugitive emissions.

Professor

Te Yu Chien (PhD, University of Tennessee) is an Associate Professor in the Department of Physics & Astronomy. He joined UW in 2013. Within his lab, his current research interests include utilizing the developed technique of cross-sectional scanning tunnelling microscopy and spectroscopy (XSTM/S) for non-cleavable materials on all-oxide electronic devices, next generation solar cell devices, probing magnetic skrymions, topological and quantum materials, high entropy materials, developing new capabilities with STM, and synthesizing novel and/or high value materials. He is currently teaching Modern Physics and Condensed Matter Physics Journal Club.
