EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Department of Intercollegiate Athletics (DIA) is embarking on an exciting 2025-2026 academic/athletic year.

The challenges facing athletics are many, but the opportunities are equal. With the recent House Settlement, ever-changing NIL/collective rules/regulations and on-going lawsuits regarding conference realignment, the landscape is complex and challenging for the university.

Over the past year, the Mountain West (MW) has gone through significant realignment. More specifically, 5 institutions (Boise State, Colorado State, Fresno State, San Diego State and Utah State) all announced they will be leaving the conference and joining Oregon State and Washington State in the Pac-12 (beginning in 2026). The MW has subsequently added new institutions in Grand Canyon, Hawaii, Northern Illinois (football only) UC Davis and UTEP. All of these changes create opportunities and challenges which put Wyoming in a tenuous position including the financial outcome associated with the current lawsuits. That said, while the lawsuits are progressing - a final resolution is not expected for multiple years.

President Seidel and I are in constant communication with the MW Staff, MW Board and MW Athletic Directors to make sure we are out in front and do whatever possible to position the University of Wyoming in the best overall position going forward.

We have also secured the services of Collegiate Consulting to conduct a comprehensive economic valuation (impact study) of the UW Athletic Department on the state of Wyoming and Laramie community. Results of the impact study should be released soon.

I have been a Division I Athletic Director for over 20 years, and this past year has been one of the most chaotic I have seen in the industry. However, as noted above, with this chaos comes challenges <u>and</u> opportunities. We need to continue to be assertive and aggressive to maximize these opportunities.

Once again, our 400+ student-athletes have done great in the classroom and the community. Listed below are a few of our academic highlights from this past year (2024-2025).

- The annual student-athlete GPA was a 3.42.
 - o Men's Golf had the highest annual team GPA of 3.87.
- 197 student-athletes earned MW All-Conference Honors
- 140 student-athletes earned MW Scholar-Athlete awards

I believe UW Athletics is positioned well for a successful 2025-2026 and it will start with our Fall sports, which started in mid-August.

The University of Wyoming Family Medicine R	esidency Programs (FMRP) are accredited

The University of Wyoming Family Medicine Residency Programs (FMRP) are accredited through the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME). Each year, the director of the FMRP (officially titled the Designated Intuitional Official or DIO) works with the Graduate Medical Education Committee (GMEC) to conduct a GMEC-required Annual Institutional Review (AIR). The AIR functions as the annual evaluation of the FMRP with the goal of identifying areas of success and areas of improvement needed to ensure long-term success and sustainability. The AIR is generated from a comprehensive assessment of FMRP successes, challenges and opportunities.

Per ACGME accreditation guidelines, "The DIO must annually submit a written executive summary of the AIR to the Sponsoring Institution's Governing Body," which for the UW FMRP is the Board of Trustees. Attached is the 2024 AIR Executive Summary for the UW FMRP, created and approved by the GMEC, the DIO, and the Dean of the College of Health Sciences. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

During fiscal year 2025, the University of Wyoming Foundation's endowment experienced incremental growth from \$827.1 million to \$892.9 million. Much like fiscal year 2024, this increase was largely attributable to our public equity returns. For FY 2025, our total estimated lagged return was 8.61%, falling 39 basis points short of our 9% cost of capital target. Private equity results, which have been very poor, were largely driven by a write down of our venture capital position in Custodia Bank to our capital invested, pending the 10 Circuit Court of Appeals case being heard on our Master Account application. Positive developments outside of the case continue to build alongside our joint venture partner Vantage Bank in Texas. The coming fiscal year should be good for Custodia and we hope to share better results with you.

Our policy benchmark, which returned 12.4% was driven by two factors 1) the private equity benchmark, which is derived from the Russell 3000 (a public equity index) + 300 basis points, returned 18.8% for its component in fiscal year 2025 - far above observed actual private equity returns and 2) the public equity benchmark, MSCI ACWI Total Return Index, which returned 16.2%. Benchmark equity returns were once again concentrated within the Magnificent 7.

Our largest exposure by strategy in public equity during fiscal year 2025 continued to be the DoubleLine Enhanced Cape Strategy. Starting at the end of Q3 2024 however, we began to

reallocate out of DoubleLine into the Vanguard S&P 500 ETF and small cap growth strategies like Fuller & Thaler Behavioral Small Cap Growth Fund. We also redeemed an underperforming mid-cap equity manager during the year as well.

We continue to pursue a strategy to increase the amount of contractual income generated by the portfolio. Fixed income and private debt are the primary contributors. At the end of June 2025, the portfolio's yield was at 2.3%, we are targeting 4% over time as we build out allocations.

In terms of performance relative to our peers, especially those with assets exceeding \$250 million, our FY2024 performance lands in the 4th quartile. Over the past three, five, and 10 years, our standings were in the 4th quartile, 4th quartile and 2nd quartiles, respectively. These returns are disappointing and primarily related to poor venture capital returns mentioned in the executive summary.

Much as in years past, our ongoing strategy is twofold: simplifying our portfolio structure and focus efforts to reduce associated fees. These steps, along with a judicious approach to risk, will steer us towards realizing long-term returns that should surpass our cost of capital.



Report on the University of Wyoming 2023+ Strategic Plan (AY 24-25) Presented to the University of Wyoming Board of Trustees September 2025

Objective 1: Enhance Student Success

Commitment: Integrate best practices in teaching and learning to produce skills required for life, work, citizenship, and adaptation to the needs of a changing world

- Achieved a 79% retention rate for first-time, full-time students from fall 2023 to fall 2024.
- Achieved a 4-year graduation rate of 63% for transfer students entering UW in fall of 2020, despite complications due to COVID-19.
- The annual aggregate GPA for all NCAA athletic teams was 3.19, tied with 2023-2024 for the highest year on record.
- Launched new academic programs relevant to the needs of students, employers, and the state of Wyoming including an M.S. in environment, natural resources, and society; B.S. in applied computing; and certificates in nuclear engineering.
- Launched the Express Transfer Agreement (ETA) program with Laramie County
 Community College. ETA provides students in select majors co-admission and co-advising services to ease the transfer from community college to UW.
- Established the Graduate Distinguished Scholars program to recruit and mentor exceptional graduate students.
- The School of Computing, UW's interdisciplinary computing hub, became an independent unit, expanding its impact on teaching, learning, and research with 184 students enrolled in classes and 21 academic and research positions hired.
- Established the Wind River Promise scholarship to provide enhanced financial support for the Eastern Shoshone and Northern Arapaho tribes.
- Signed MOU with Wyoming Business Alliance to enhance hands-on learning opportunities for students.

Objective 2: Pursue Institutional Excellence

Commitment: Nurture a culture of diverse ideas and knowledge creation that promotes teaching, learning, community engagement, economic development and world-class research.

- Achieved Research 1 (R1) status from the Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education.
- Received the Innovation and Economic Prosperity designation from the Association of Public and Land Grant Universities.
- Advanced the University's Artificial Intelligence initiative through new academic programs, faculty hires, and raising \$6.25 million in private dollars which was matched by state funds for a total of \$8.25 million.
- Partnered with the Constructive Dialogue Institute to make training in constructive dialogue available to faculty, staff, and students as part of our nationally recognized freedom of expression initiative.
- Established the Jay Kemmerer Wyoming Outdoor Recreation Tourism and Hospitality (WORTH) institute to provide enhanced support to the state's second largest industry, with a major \$5 million gift.
- Developed and placed Josh Allen-themed Super Bowl ad, reaching 16.5 million viewers in key markets around the country
- Established the One UW Council to enhance collaboration in marketing and communications in units at UW, the UW Foundation, and UW Alumni Association and hosted the first Ride for the Brand Summit for communications professionals across campus.
- Continued progress on Phase II of the Wyoming Gas Injection Initiative which seeks to develop advanced oil recovery techniques for deposits in Wyoming.
- Launched the President's Distinguished Scholars to recruit and retain outstanding faculty in all academic disciplines.
- UW was named one of the top 100 universities with the most patents by the National Academy of Inventors.

Objective 3: Provide a Supportive Community

Commitment: Foster a culture of community that values and cares for students, faculty, and staff

Major Accomplishments

- Launched Wellness in the WEST (Where Everyone Strengthens Together), UW's comprehensive wellness program dedicated to supporting the mental, emotional, and physical well-being of faculty, staff, and students.
- To promote inclusivity and transparency, President Seidel redesigned his leadership team to include Vice President and Deans; notes of the UW Leadership Team are publicly available via the President's website.
- Enhanced communication and support protocols for deceased students and employees.
- Continued Access & Engagement work to ensure all members of the UW community have access to the resources they need to be successful inside and outside of the classroom.
- Supported campus with compliance with new state laws including HB 172 Repeal Gun Free Zones and Preemption Amendment and HB 147 Prohibition of Institutional Discrimination.
- Launched the Faculty Leadership Institute and continued the President Leadership Institute for staff to enhance opportunities for employees to grow their leadership skills
- Established the UW Engagement Council, a stakeholder group that provides input and support on community engagement programs, policies, and priorities.

Objective 4: Engage with and Serve the State of Wyoming

Commitment: Sustain and enhance our extensive service to and engagement with the State to improve the mental, physical, and economic health of Wyoming and its residents.

- A study by the Center for Business and Economic Analysis found that UW's annual economic impact on the state of Wyoming is \$1.36 billion, including the impact of alumni.
- Held six UW in Your Community events around the state.

- Scaled the Trustees Education Initiative (TEI) programs, serving 32+ districts and 12,000 students/educators annually; launched the Principal Leadership Academy Cohort 2; advanced CTE licensure reforms; expanded High Altitude Pathways career readiness; and secured \$5.8 million in external funding.
- Expanded the impact of state-wide programs including the Low-Income Tax Clinic.
- UW Extension teams taught 4,811 programs, made direct contact with 117,361 youth and adults, and completed 11,457 instructional hours.
- Established the Community Engaged Faculty Institute to support faculty in developing community-engaged and service-learning curricula.
- The Science Institute continued its impact on the state of Wyoming with including Science Initiative Roadshow and the STEM Carnival.
- A statewide survey conducted by WYSAC indicated improved UW connection with Wyoming communities; notably, 88 percent of survey respondents answered "extremely well" or "quite well" when asked how well UW appeals to Wyoming students and their families as a desirable place to attend college.
- The Small Business Development Center Network and Manufacturing Works served small businesses across Wyoming through technical assistance and connections to resources.
- Solidified UW's membership in the Mountain West Conference, maintaining Division
 1 Athletics at UW.

Objective 5: Cultivate Financial Stability and Diversification

Commitment: Ensure the long-term vitality of UW through diversification and growth of revenue streams and effective application of resources, infrastructure, and processes.

- Total research expenditures increased to \$167 million, a 78% increase in three years, reaching an all-time high level.
- New grants for research, service and instruction reached \$150 million, another record number.
- \$69.5 million raised by the UW Foundation, the highest level raised in a single year on record.
- The 10th annual Giving Day set records with 11,202 donors who gave more than \$4.1 million, making it the most successful Giving Day in the university's history.
- Continued planning for a new, university-wide budget model that is more responsive to change and rewards sustainable and strategic growth.

- For the third year in a row, UW received a clean external audit and a clean single audit of federal awards.
- Continued planning toward a comprehensive fundraising campaign, including the development of a campaign readiness report.

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UNIVERSITY OF WYOMING ANNUAL INSTITUTIONAL REVIEW EXECUTVE SUMMARY 2024-2025

Institution

The Institution continues to maintain Continued Accreditation, the highest level of accreditation by the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME), without any citations or areas for improvement. Additionally, the ACGME required self-study was completed in October 2023, with the 10-year accreditation site visit tentatively scheduled for October 2025.

The ACGME conducted a Clinical Learning Environment Review (CLER) visit on June 11–12, 2024, at Casper EHCW, our primary clinical training site where the majority of residents complete their rotations. This comprehensive review focused on evaluating and providing feedback regarding patient safety, health care quality, teamwork, supervision, resident well-being, and professionalism within the clinical learning environment. Following receipt of the CLER report, our Graduate Medical Education Committee conducted a thorough analysis of the findings and developed a strategic response plan. This plan includes targeted action items for EHCW implementation designed to enhance patient safety initiatives, improve resident satisfaction, strengthen interdisciplinary communication protocols, and provide more robust feedback mechanisms for residents regarding patient outcomes and quality reporting processes.

The Graduate Medical Education Department implemented several key initiatives to strengthen program infrastructure and enhance the educational environment. We developed an improved anonymous feedback system that allows residents and faculty to report concerns directly to the GME Department, fostering open communication and continuous improvement. Additionally, we created a comprehensive Institutional Curriculum for residents and faculty that emphasizes compliance and professional development, scheduled for implementation on July 1, 2025. To celebrate our community's achievements, we launched a GME Newsletter highlighting the accomplishments and activities of our residents, faculty, and staff throughout the academic year.

Our commitment to excellence extended to operational and structural improvements that ensure sustained program quality. The GME Department expanded the leadership team by hiring a dedicated GME Business Manager to handle budgetary and operational management, and an Associate Designated Institutional Official to assist with institutional oversight, accreditation compliance, and program administration. We enhanced our Graduate Medical Education Committee meeting framework to meet ACGME standards for institutional oversight and program supervision, while establishing new bylaws for the GME Family Medicine Department for implementation in the upcoming academic year. Strategic faculty recruitment efforts at both Casper and Cheyenne Family Medicine programs successfully met ACGME minimum requirements, strengthening our educational capacity. Financial stewardship was prioritized through the creation of a streamlined GME Department budget that establishes complete departmental oversight and fiscal accountability. Additionally, we submitted a competitive HRSA Primary Care Training and Enhancement grant application for Residency Training in Street Medicine, with funding decisions anticipated by July 1, 2025.

Initial planning commenced for a consortium sponsoring institution model involving the University of Wyoming, EHCW, Banner-WMC, and CRMC as key partners. While preliminary meetings were conducted to explore this collaborative approach, the initiative was placed on hold mid-year as institutional attention turned to other priority areas, including evolving relationships with consortium partners. The GME Department anticipates resuming these discussions in the next academic year to further develop this innovative sponsorship model that could enhance educational opportunities and resource sharing across our partner institutions.

<u>Cheyenne:</u> The Cheyenne Family Medicine residency program received Continued Accreditation with no citations or areas for improvement.

The program had a very successful 2025 Match. They implemented a new approach to recruitment by increasing engagement of the faculty and residents with a standardized assessment model, which resulted in matching a full class of candidates to begin in July 2025.

The results of the ACGME resident survey showed the program at or above the national Family Medicine specialty average in 7 of the 8 domains (resources, professionalism, patient safety and teamwork, faculty teaching and supervision, evaluation, educational content, and clinical experience and education). The program fell slightly below the specialty average only in the patient population domain. Notably, 100% of residents gave the program an overall positive evaluation, and 87% of residents indicated they would choose the program again.

The resident well-being survey demonstrated that the program provides an exceptionally supportive work environment, with over 90% of residents reporting that they find their work meaningful, work in a supportive environment, participate in decisions that affect their work, view their work as a positive challenge, and feel engaged and respected at work. The program faculty survey was equally positive, with 100% of faculty providing favorable program evaluations. Most responses within the various educational domains met or exceeded the specialty mean, reflecting strong faculty confidence in the program.

These outstanding survey results demonstrate the program's successful implementation of initiatives designed to enhance program satisfaction and maintain high educational standards.

The program is recognized for its highly engaged faculty who demonstrate exceptional commitment to resident education and program excellence. Successful faculty recruitment efforts have ensured compliance with ACGME requirements for core faculty-to-resident ratios. Beginning July 2025, Dr. Jody Cousins will join the leadership team as an additional Associate Program Director, further strengthening the program's administrative structure and educational oversight.

Casper

The Casper Family Medicine residency program received Continued Accreditation with no citations or areas for improvement, demonstrating the program's commitment to educational excellence and regulatory compliance.

The program has navigated faculty attrition and coverage challenges through active recruitment efforts to maintain ACGME minimum accreditation standards for faculty numbers. Obstetric coverage remains a significant concern requiring ongoing attention and strategic planning. To strengthen program leadership and address these operational challenges, Dr. Adam Heessel and Dr. Blaine Levy joined the leadership team as Associate Program Directors in April 2025, bringing increased administrative support and enhanced program management capabilities.

The program experienced a challenging match cycle this year, with only 4 of the 8 positions initially filled. However, through the SOAP process, the program successfully filled all positions for the incoming class beginning July 2025. Additionally, the program will have an open PGY-2 position available due to non-renewal of a resident contract for the 2025-2026 academic year, and recruitment efforts are currently underway to fill this position.

Faculty engagement remained exceptionally strong, with ACGME faculty survey results demonstrating 100% positive overall program evaluations. Across individual domains including resources, professionalism, patient safety and teamwork, faculty teaching and supervision, and educational

content, the majority of the program's mean responses met or exceeded specialty benchmarks, Page 43 reflecting faculty confidence in the program's educational mission.

The ACGME resident survey provided valuable insights that have informed targeted program enhancements across all evaluated domains. The Program Director has proactively engaged with residents through direct meetings and comprehensive internal surveys to better understand resident perspectives and develop strategic improvement initiatives. While recent faculty transitions have presented opportunities to strengthen both faculty support systems and resident experiences, the program continues to demonstrate strong foundational strengths.

Notably, resident feedback revealed significant positive indicators: 67% of residents provided favorable overall program evaluations, and more than half indicated they would choose the program again, demonstrating continued confidence in the educational experience. The resident well-being survey yielded particularly encouraging results, with over 50% of residents reporting meaningful work experiences within a supportive environment where they feel respected and appropriately challenged. These outcomes underscore the program's success in maintaining resident satisfaction and well-being while implementing continuous quality improvement measures to enhance the educational experience across all domains.

Osteopathic Recognition Track – Casper: The Osteopathic Track achieved Continued Recognition with no citations but one area for improvement regarding providing formal documentation of scholarly activity for graduating residents. The program continues to demonstrate commitment to maintaining high osteopathic training standards and delivering educational excellence in osteopathic medical education.

Geriatric Medicine Fellowship – Casper: The Geriatric Medicine fellowship received Continued Accreditation with no citations or areas for improvement. In August 2024, Dr. Stanco, a graduate of our fellowship program, joined the faculty, demonstrating the program's success in developing academic leaders. The program continues to leverage GWEP Grant funding to expand community education and awareness regarding geriatric care needs. Furthermore, the University of Wyoming Family Practice earned recognition from the Institute for Healthcare Improvement (IHI) as a Level 1 Age-Friendly Health System Participant, reflecting our commitment to evidence-based geriatric care standards.

Thermopolis Rural Training Track (RTT) – Casper/Thermopolis: The Rural Training Track program in Thermopolis received Continued Accreditation with no citations or areas for improvement. The Title VII grant is expected to conclude in July 2025. Moving forward, clinical income cost report adjustments and FQHC GME funding will be utilized at both the core and rural sites to ensure ongoing financial sustainability. The program has demonstrated its commitment to retaining quality physicians in the community by hiring its most recent graduate to join the faculty, reflecting the program's success in developing local healthcare leaders.

Highlighted Achievements in 2024-2025

- Continued the development of a GME Department with the hiring of a GME Business Manager in September 2024 and an Associate Designated Institutional (DIO) in April 2025.
- Developed an improved anonymous feedback mechanism for residents and faculty to report any issues or concerns directly to the GME Department.
- Developed an Institutional Curriculum for residents and faculty highlighting compliance and professional development beginning July 1, 2025.
- Developed a GME Newsletter to highlight the achievements and activities of GME residents, faculty and staff.
- Enhanced our Graduate Medical Education Committee meeting framework to meet ACGME standards for proper institutional oversight and program supervision.

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- Established new bylaws for the GME Family Medicine Department to be enacted during the upcoming academic year.
- Hired additional faculty at both Casper and Cheyenne Family Medicine programs to meet the ACGME minimum program requirements.
- Submitted a HRSA Primary Care Training and Enhancement grant application for Residency Training in Street Medicine, with award notification expected by July 1, 2025.
- Created a streamlined the Graduate Medical Education Department budget for the upcoming academic year, establishing complete departmental oversight and fiscal accountability.

Highlighted Action Plans for 2025-2026

- Reinstate consortium meetings to resume development of the collaborative sponsoring institution model with University of Wyoming, EHCW, Banner-WMC, and CRMC partners.
- Prepare for the upcoming 10-year ACGME institutional accreditation site visit tentatively scheduled tentatively for October 2025.

<u>Summary:</u> Graduate Medical Education at the University of Wyoming has demonstrated remarkable resilience and growth during the 2024-2025 academic year. Despite navigating financial constraints and operational challenges, our programs have not only maintained but enhanced their educational excellence, with all programs achieving Continued Accreditation without citations or areas for improvement.

The establishment of a robust GME Department infrastructure through strategic hiring of key leadership positions, including a GME Business Manager and Associate Designated Institutional Official, to our already established GME Institutional Manager, has strengthened our operational capacity and compliance oversight. Our commitment to continuous improvement is evidenced by the implementation of enhanced feedback mechanisms, development of institutional curricula, and successful faculty recruitment efforts across all programs that meet ACGME requirements.

While individual programs faced unique challenges—from faculty transitions in Casper to successful recruitment innovations in Cheyenne—each demonstrated adaptability and maintained strong educational outcomes. The exceptional performance on ACGME surveys, with faculty showing 100% positive evaluations across programs and residents reporting high satisfaction and well-being scores, reflects our sustained focus on creating supportive learning environments.

Our forward-looking initiatives, including grant applications for innovative training programs and exploration of consortium partnership models, position us well for future growth and sustainability. Most importantly, we continue to fulfill our core mission of cultivating exceptional healthcare professionals who choose to build their careers within Wyoming's communities. Through retaining our locally-educated graduates, we contribute directly to fortifying the state's healthcare infrastructure and improving patient care quality throughout the region. As our program alumni enter clinical practice across Wyoming, they bring specialized knowledge and a deep understanding of local healthcare needs, ensuring residents receive care from professionals who are both highly trained and invested in their communities' wellbeing. This continuous development and retention of skilled clinicians not only raises healthcare standards but also drives meaningful economic development across the state. Through strategic planning and unwavering commitment to excellence, the University of Wyoming GME programs remain a vital force in advancing healthcare education and improving health outcomes across the region.
