A special meeting of the Board of Trustees of the University of Wyoming was called to order by President Bond at 7:30 p.m., Tuesday, October 25. The following members answered roll call. Mrs. Oviatt, Mr. Geddes, Mr. Elliott, Mr. Lynn, Mrs. Embree, and President Crane.

Dr. Cloyd Heck Marvin, President of George Washington University, and Dr. Samuel P. Capen, Chancellor of the University of Buffalo, met with the Trustees. Drs. Capen and Marvin are making a survey of this University for the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching. The Board immediately went into executive session with the surveyors, adjourning at 12:30 a.m.

9 a.m. - Wednesday, October 26.

Dr. Marvin again met with the Trustees and presented orally certain recommendations which were the result of his study up to the present time.

Upon reconvening after lunch Dr. Marvin, Mr. Harold A. McKay, State Budget Officer, and Mr. J. E. Lee, President of the Wyoming Tax Payers' League, met with the Board.

Dr. Crane presented the proposed University State Budget with much supporting data, and several charts illustrating the proposed decreases. After discussion Mr. Lynn moved that this budget be approved as presented, and that all of us, both as members of the Board and as

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Dr. Crane then reported the meeting with representatives of the Wyoming Agricultural Council. It was suggested by the Council that the Council and others representing Wyoming's agricultural interests be invited each year to confer with the University authorities in planning programs for Agricultural Extension, Research, and State Farms. A second suggestion was the formation of advisory committees in each county in which a State Farm is located, whose function it shall be to assis t in planning programs for each farm. The President and Dean of the College of Agriculture concur in these suggestions and recommend that they be authorized to invite such cooperation and that they take steps to secure the organization of these advisory regional or community committees. Upon the motion of Mr. Lynn, seconded by Mrs. Embree and carried, the above recommendation was approved.

Dr. Crane then mentioned a letter which he had received from the officers of the Junior Class requesting that at the Winter and Spring term registration periods the university collect from each junior \$2.25 each term for the purchase of a WYO. After discussion Mr. Lynn moved that this assessment be ap roved provided a majority vote of three-fourths of the Junior Class approve such assessment. This motion was seconded by Mr. Elliott and carried.

Upon the motion of Mrs. Embree \$500.00 was appropriated for additional campus police services. This motion was seconded by Mr. Elliott and carried.

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Upon the motion of Mr. Lynn, Dean Carl F. Arnold of the Law School was authorized to attend the meeting of the Association of American Law Schools to be held in Chicago in December; estimated expense \$95.00 to be paid from the Law School travel appropriation. This motion was seconded by Mr. Elliott and carried.

Upon the motion of Mrs. Oviatt the Trustees voted that Dr. Crane be requested to take such leave of absence as his duties will permit prior to the convening of the Legislature, and that he take three or four months leave of absence after the adjournment of the Legislature. This motion was seconded by Mrs. Embree and carried.

Upon the motion of Mr. Lynn it was moved that Mrs. Oviatt, who is our delegate to the meeting of the National Association of Governing Boards and Allied Institutions, be authorized to invite the Association to meet at the University of Wyoming next year. This motion was seconded by Mrs. Embree and carried.

There being no further business, the Board adjourned
