(a)	Obliger: The Trustees of the University of Wyoming;
(b)	Type: Special obligation, Student Union Building revenue, serial, coupon bond;
(c)	Denomination: \$1,000; (d) Date: November 1, 1937;
(e)	Interest rate and interest payment dates: 4 percent per annum payable semi-annually on May 1 and November 1 in each year.
(f)	Place of payment: At the office of the fiscal agent of the University of Wyoming, in Laramie, Wyoming, or, at the option of the holder, at a bank or trust company in the Borough of Manhattan, City and State of New York;
(g)	Registration privileges: Registerable as to principal only;
(h)	Maturities; On November 1 in amounts and years as follows:
	\$2,000 in 1940 to 1953, inclusive \$3,000 in 1954 to 1962, inclusive, and \$4,000 in 1963 to 1967, inclusive;
(i)	Redemption provisions: Redeemable in inverse order of matur- ity, on any interest payment date, in whole or in part, at the option of the Applicant, at par and accrued interest, plus a premium of $\frac{1}{4}$ of 1 percent for each year or fraction thereof from the date of redemption to the date of maturity;

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2. This Offer is conditioned upon the Applicant's depositing in the Construction Account described in the Terms and Conditions, prior to the payment by the United States of America for any obligations which it herein offers to purchase, the sum of \$15,750 or such other amount as may be necessary to complete the Project, in addition to the funds to be furnished by the United States of America.

3. By acceptance of this Offer the Applicant covenants to begin work on the Project as early as possible but in no event later than 10 weeks from the date of this offer and to complete such Project with all practicable dispatch, and in any event within 15 months from the commencement of construction.

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The above Resolution was seconded by Dr. Diggs and was adopted, with the following voting aye: Mr. Bond, Mr. Guthrie, Mr. Friday, Dr. Diggs, Mr. Marshall, Mr. Facinelli, and Mr. Linn, and the following voting nay: Resolution None. Adopted The President thereupon declared said Resolution carried and the President and Secretary thereupon signed said Resolution in approval thereof. Mr. Favinelli then moved that it is the sense of this Board that and furnishings we endeavor to secure a \$240,000 building, and endeavor to finance it by the Sala of sale of \$150,000 bonds, purchase of these bonds by the State from the Uni-Bonds versity Permanent Funds preferred, otherwise by public offer. The bonds shall bear not to exceed 4% interest and shall mature serially in not to exceed thirty years. The motion was seconded by Dr. Diggs and carried. The Trustees then received Mr. A. C. Shoemaker, Mr. W.R. Morton, Goshan County Agant Mr. Guy Marlatt, 4-H Club Leader, and Mrs. Madge Smith, Secretary of the Goshen County Farm Bureau, with a plea that County Agent Gibson be retained in Goshen County. The Trustees took the request under advisement. Then followed a lengthy discussion of the facilities that might be Dormitory Space in Student incorporated in the new building, including a dormitory. It was moved by Mr. Facinelli that we proceed to expend this money for a combined building Union Building having both student union and dormitory facilities, but that the maximum quantity of space be used for student union purposes. The motion was

seconded by Mr. Marshall and unanimously carried.

Upon the motion of Mr. Marshall, authority was given for the quarrying of stone and the starting of the campus student stone cutting

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project, as soon as full assent to this project is received from P.W.A. The motion was seconded by Mr. Facinelli and carried.

Upon the motion of Mr. Guthrie, President Crane was designated Executive Officer and correspondent of the Board in all matters relating to the Student Union Building and the Public Works Administration. The Executive Committee was authorized to make decisions and authorize changes in contracts and plans that may arise during the recess of the Board and the President and Secretary of the Board were authorized to sign all necessary papers including the bonds of the issue above provided for. The motion was seconded by Mr. Friday and carried.

It was moved by Mr. Marshall, seconded by Mr. Linn and carried that the Executive Committee be authorized to act on the proposal received from the N.Y.A. offering the University approximately \$1,000 monthly as a work project for student housing. This authority is dependent upon an affirmative opinion from the attorney general, permitting the use of dormitory funds for our share of this project over and above the budgetary limitation.

Dr. Diggs then moved that the site for the Student Union Building be tentatively approved as located at the corner of 13th street and the inner-campus drive, subject to final approval at the December meeting of the Board. The motion was seconded by Mr. Facinelli and carried.

Upon the motion of Mr.Facinelli, seconded by Mr. Marshall and unanimously carried, the following resolution was adopted:

State Commissioner of Public Lands, Mr. McWhinnie, requests that our Certificate be returned and he will issue a new Certificate for about 159 acres, giving the University credit for all payments made on the original 160 acre Certificate.
