A The regular quarterly meeting of the Board of Trustees of the University of Wyoming was called to order by President Bond at 2 o'clock p.m. Friday, March 25, 1938. Those present included Mrs. Harriett T. Grieve, Mr. Roll Cdll J.A. Guthrie, Mr. C.H. Friday, Mrs. Evelyn S. Plummer, Mr. D.P.B.Marshall, Dr. S.H. Diggs, Mr. V.J. Facinelli, Mr. Ralph S.Linn, and Dr. A.G. Crane. Dr. Crane presented his report. Upon the motion of Mr. Marshall, Mr. Ambrose was designated Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds under the Superintendent of President's Office. This will relieve Mr. Fuller of these various duties Buildings and and permit him to devote his full time to his duties as Purchasing Agent and Grounds Land, Gas, and Oil Inspector, which have increased with the growth of the institution. The motion was seconded by Mr. Friday and carried. Appoint mants Upon the motion of Mr. Ecinelli, seconded by Mr. Guthrie and carried, and leaves ofthe following appointments and leaves of absence were approved: a bsence Miss Phyllis Richards, Home Demonstration Agent for Lincoln County, at a salary rate of \$1,800 per year, effective April 1, 1938. Miss Richards Richards succeeds Vesta Wright, resigned. Dr. Alfred Larson, Instructor in History, at a salary of \$2,196, per larson year, effective September 1, 1938. Dr. Larson will substitute for Dr. White, who will be on Sabbatical leave. C. Wesley Roath, Superintendent of Experiments on the farm at the Roath Wyoming Industrial Institute at Worland, at a salary rate of \$1,800 per year, effective March 26, 1938. Mr. Roath is transferred from the Torrington Farm, and succeeds Mr. A.S. Ingraham, resigned. Stewart W. M. Stewart, Instructor in Mathematics, leave of absence without pay for the academic year 1938-39. Dunnewald T. J. Dunnewald, Associate Professor of Agronomy, Sabbatical leave for one year, beginning September 1, 1938. French Francelia French, Assistant Professor of Public School Music, Sabbatical leave for the academic year 1938-39. Dr. Lillian Portenier, Associate Professor of Psychology, Sabbatical Portenier leave for the academic year 1938-39. Dr. Laura A. White, Professor of Hystory, Sabbatical leave for the White academic year 1938-39. Lilley Young, Assistant Professof of History, in the College of Young Education, Sabbatical leave for the academic year 1938-39.

Mr. Facinelli moved that President Crane and Dean Hill be empowered to select a new Superintendent for the Goshen County Experiment Farm, at a salary rate of \$1,600 per year, as soon as a suitable candidate can be found. The Executive Committee is authorized to confirm this appointment. The motion was seconded by Mr. Marshall and carried.

Upon the motion of Mr. Marshall, Dean Goodrich was authorized to sell an obsolete steel condenser drum for \$50.00, and credit this amount to the Mechanical Engineering Revolving Fund. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Grieve and carried.

Dr. Crane then informed the Trustees of the problems connected with the construction, operation, and financing of the Student Union Building, including interest and bond retirement. He submitted a financial schedule showing the situation, including the assessment of fees against the students in accordance with the student vote. After discussion, Mrs. Plummer moved approval of the President's scheme for management of these funds, with the reservation that the Board can modify the student fee assessment from time to time as may be necessary. President Crane is authorized to submit this entire plan to Attorney-General Lee for his approval. The motion was seconded by Dr. Diggs and carried.

Dr. Crane next presented a preliminary budget for the Main University for the coming year, showing changes from the present budget, and a summary #of the financial situation. After discussion, Dr. Diggs moved that the budget for the coming year carry an unappropriated item of \$15,000. The motion was seconded by Mr. Marshall and carried.

Dr. Diggs then moved that Dr. Crane be authorized to enter into salary contracts for the coming year with continuing faculty members and Engineering sale

Mr. Marshall called attention to a question now appearing which had not been submitted in Dr. Crane's original letter. This is the question of farm sales. After discussion Mr. Marshall moved that the Board request Dr. Crane and Dean Arnold to ask the Attorney-General, either orally or by letter, how farm sales should be handled in order to conform to the principle set forth in his recent opinion. The motion was seconded by Mr. Guthrie and carried.

Upon the motion of Mr. Marshall, seconded by Mr. Guthrie and carried, State Farms Budget the State Farms Budget for the new year was approved as presented.

It was moved by Mr. Marshall that President Crane's contract be renewed for two years on the same basis as at present. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Grieve and carried.

The minutes of the December Board meeting, the Special Meeting, February 18th, and the various meetings of the Executive Committee were approved as read.

The Board adjourned sine die at 4:30 p.m. March 26th.
