The regular quarterly meeting of the Board of Trustees of the University of Wyoming was called to order by President Bond at 2 o'clock p.m., Rollcall Friday, September 23, 1938. Those present included Mr. J. A. Guthrie, Mr. C. H. Fridey, Dr. S. H. Diggs, Mr. D.P.B. Marshall, Mr. V. J. Facinelli, Mr. Ralph S. Linn, and Dr. A. G. Crane. The minutes of the Board meeting held June 6th and of the Special Board meeting held July 9th were approved as read, as were the minutes of Minutes read the Executive Committee meetings held June 30th, July 25th, and August 25th. David Hitchcock, president of the A.S.U.W. and the Student Senate, and Ralph Meyers, manager of the A.S.U.W., then appeared before the Trustees to request the attitude of the Board toward the acceptance of liquor Request for liquor advertisements advertisements in University publications. After discussion, Mr. Facinelli moved that we advise the various student publications that it is the policy of this Board that no advertisements from liquor manufacturing companies be accepted, nor advertisements from business firms whose sole business is that of handling liouor. However, it is permissible to accept advertisements from hotels or establishments handling other commodities in addition to liquor, if no mention is made of the bar. The motion was seconded by Mr. Marshall and carried.

It was then moved by Mr. Friday, seconded by Mr. Linn and carried that the Trustees extend a vote of thanks to Mr. Hitchcock and Mr. Meyers for their fine cooperative spirit.

Mr. Marshall moved that Hugh B. McFadden be appointed Instructor in Psychology for the Winter and Spring Quarters of the year 1939, at a salary of \$1,020.00. Mr. McFadden will substitute for Miss Portenier who has been granted a Sabbatical leave of absence for these two quarters. He will be paid from the 60% balance of Miss Portenier's salary. Upon the motion of Mr. Facinelli, and effective September, 1938, Wyoming Union the Trustees authorized a levy of \$1.25 on each student each quarter as a Fees for taculty and students Student Union fee, and approved an assessment of \$9.00 per year or \$3.00 per quarter during the regular year against each faculty member in accordance with faculty action approving such assessment. These fees are to be placed in a fund known as the Wyoming Union Income Account, from which expenditures are to be made as directed by the Board of Trustees. The motion Wyoming Union Income Account was seconded by Dr. Diggs and carried. The board then examined bids which had been received the previous day, covering the tunnel and services for the Union Building. P.W.A. Engineer Findlay and Mr. Ambrose were present. The bids were as follows: Bids tor Services at Wyoming Union City Plumbing and Heating Company, Laramie, Wyoming -\$14,940.00 Woehler and Force Company, Greeley, Colorado -\$14,700.00 Upon the motion of Mr. Marshall, seconded by Dr. Diggs and unanimously carried, the following resolution was adopted. Be it resolved that the low bid of Woehler and Force Company, Greeley, Colorado, for the installation of tunnel, sewer, water, heating Wochler + Force. and electrical services to the Student Union Building, Docket Wyoming 1059 awarded services D.S. be tentatively approved by the Trustees of the University of Wyoming and submitted to the Regional Director, P.W.A. for consideration. Be it further resolved that if approval of the Regional Director, P.W.A., is given this award, that the President and Secretary of the Trustees of the University of Wyoming be empowered to execute the necessary documents awarding the contract to Woehler and Force Compeny, of Greeley, Colorado. Be it further resolved that President A.G. Crane, the authorized Livene given power to request verision correspondent, be empowered to request the revision of the estimated costs of the estimated costs. of the project to conform with the costs involved in this award.

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Dr. Diggs moved that an appropriation of \$2,000 be made to cover emergency teaching for the Fall Quarter, the Executive Committee to be without discretion to increase this amount. The motion was seconded by Mr.	Emergency Teaching Appropriation

archaeological sites in Wyoming. After discussion, Dr. Diggs moved that	
the University agree to act as sponsor for such a project, subject to the
