Record of Minutes of Board of Trustees Meeting April 15

In order to promote the general welfare of the University and to insure greater efficiency in the administrative and academic branches thereof, the Board of Trustees declares and adopts the following policy:

All employees shall be placed on a limited or restricted employment on July 1st following their becoming seventy years of age.

-1 -

To be entitled to the benefits of the above provisions an employee must have rendered fifteen years service to this University as a full time paid employee.

-3-The employment of all employees who have attained the age of seventy years and who have not rendered at least fifteen years service shall be terminated on July 1st following the attainment of such age.

- 4 -

Special provisions may be made for Presidents Emeritus.

The annual salaries of all employees who have attained such age or who may hereafter attain such age shall be determined in the following manner:

The minimum salary of Deans, or officials of equal rank as shall hereafter be specified, shall be \$900.00 per year and the maximum salary shall be \$1,200.00 per year. The minimum salary of Professors in such case shall be \$700.00 per year and the maximum salary shall be \$1,000.00 per year. The minimum salary of all other employees in such case shall be \$500.00 per year and the maximum salary shall be \$800.00 per year.

The minimum salary shall be paid to those who have rendered at least fifteen years and not more than eighteen years service. All those who have served longer than eighteen years shall be paid an annual salary of \$25.00 per year for each year over eighteen years of service in addition to the minimum salary amount above stated.
