DEPARTMENTAL REALIGNMENT: THE
DEPARTMENT OF VETERINARY SCIENCES
AND THE DEPARTMENT OF MICROBIOLOGY
AND BIOCHEMISTRY

Realignments within the
College of Agriculture will
result in the proposed

titles of the Department of Veterinary Sciences and the Department of Microbiology and Biochemistry. The realignment separates Microbiology from Veterinary Sciences and merges it with Biochemistry. This restructuring will encourage more collaborative teaching, research and public service and contribute toward program improvement. The proposed restructuring has received the overwhelming support of the relevant faculty.

Under Wyoming statutes, the Department of Microbiology and Veterinary Medicine has been charged with the responsibility for managing, operating and maintaining the Wyoming State Veterinary Laboratory. Under the reorganization outlined above, the new Department of Veterinary Sciences will serve as the successor unit to the Department of Microbiology and Veterinary Medicine and will continue to manage, operate and maintain the Wyoming State Veterinary Laboratory as provided by law.

Mr. Hinckley moved that the Trustees of the University of Wyoming approve the proposed realignment effective July 9, 1985, resulting in the establishment of the Department of Veterinary Sciences and the Department of Microbiology and Biochemistry. The motion was seconded by Mr. Updike, and it carried.

DEFENSE SECURITY
RESOLUTION

Because of a change in the
membership of the Board of

Trustees, the Academic Issues Committee recommended approval of
the following resolution as it specifically applies to the Large
Aperture Infrared Telescope System (LAIRTS).

WHEREAS, a change has occurred in membership of the
Trustees of the University of Wyoming, it is recommended that
the Academic Issues Committee recommend to the Trustees of
the University of Wyoming, approval to exclude the following
new Trustees from access to all classified information in the
possession of the University. The Resolution duplicates the
original resolution passed by the Trustees of the University
of Wyoming.

RESOLVED: Such officers, other than those required to
be cleared and all Trustees shall not require, shall not
have, and can be effectively excluded from, access to all
classified information in the possession of the University
and do not occupy positions that would enable them to affect
adversely the University's policies or practices in the
performance of classified contracts or programs for the User
Agencies.

Mr. Hinckley moved approval of the above resolution. The motion
was seconded by Mr. McCue, and it carried. Trustee Schuster is
recorded as voting no.

AMENDMENT TO ASUW
CONSTITUTION

Discussion was held
regarding a proposed

amendment to the ASUW Constitution. On March 27, 1985, the
Associated Students of the University of Wyoming voted to amend
the ASUW Constitution as follows:

To Add to ASUW Constitution:

Article VI, Section 6

ASUW COMPUTER SERVICES COMMITTEE

1. Purpose - The ASUW Computer Services Committee shall conduct such research as is requested by the ASUW Senate or ASUW Standing Committees and maintain the information provided.
2. Powers - The Committee shall be advisory to the ASUW Senate and Standing Committees with regard to the research conducted by the Committee.
3. Composition - The Committee shall consist of a student director or chairperson elected from the Committee as a whole; a minimum of ten (10) members of which six (6) must be ASUW Senators; there shall be no maximum membership; and an advisor selected in accordance with the purpose of the Committee.

According to Regulations of the Trustees, Part VIII., Section 5, all amendments to the ASUW Constitution must be submitted to and approved by the Trustees before they become effective. Upon a motion by Mr. Hinckley, seconded by Mr. Mickelson, it carried to approve the above amendment to Article VI., Section 6 of the ASUW Constitution.

REVIEW OF SCHOOL OF
HUMAN MEDICINE

The Academic Issues

Committee held a discussion on the report of the review committee for the School of Human Medicine. The report was mailed to the Trustees and was prepared in response to the 1984 legislature's request for a study of "alternative and supplemental funding sources for the Family Practice Residency Programs." Dr. Rose gave a summary of the report which encompasses four major areas: the contract programs,

the Family Practice Residency Center, Continuing Medical Education, and Rural and Community Health Programs. Additional information will be provided to the Trustees for their action prior the University's response to the legislature.

UNIVERSITY OF WYOMING
OUTREACH PROGRAM

Dr. Barden reported to the
Academic Issues Committee

on the University's outreach program which includes off-campus credit and non-credit coursework, cultural programs and informational programs to meet the educational needs of Wyoming residents. A statistical summary of credit instruction offered through Extended Studies was distributed.

AUTHORIZATION FOR
FUND TRANSFER

Upon a motion by Trustee
Mickelson, seconded by

Trustee Hinckley, it carried to adopt the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Director of the University's Computer Center issued certification to the University's Vice President for Finance on June 18, 1985 stating that the project funded by "The Trustees of the University of Wyoming,

Special Purpose Revenue Bonds, Second Lien Series 1978" has been completed in accordance with relevant plans and specifications and all amounts due therefore have been paid;

WHEREAS, surplus monies of \$14,000 remain on deposit in the "University of Wyoming Special Purpose Revenue Bonds, Second Lien Series 1978 Project Acquisition Fund" account; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED that the Treasurer of the Board of Trustees, representing the Trustees of the University of Wyoming, a body corporate, is hereby directed to transfer the \$14,000 surplus monies from the "University of Wyoming Special Purpose Revenue Bonds, Second Lien Series 1978 Project Acquisition Fund" to the "University of Wyoming Second Lien Revenue Bonds, Interest and Bond Retirement Fund," as provided by Article IV, Section 405 of "The Trustees of the University of Wyoming, Special Purpose Revenue Bonds, Second Lien Series 1978," to be applied on the payment of interest on the bonds.

EXPENDITURE FROM ASUW RESERVE FUND
FOR ACQUISITION OF TELEPHONE SYSTEM

Mr. Mickelson moved the
approval for the

expenditure of funds from the ASUW Reserve Fund in an amount not to exceed \$20,000 for the acquisition of a telephone system for ASUW. The motion was seconded by Mr. Rochelle, and it carried.

MEDICAL STUDENT CONTRACT SUPPORT
PROGRAM, AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT
WITH STUDENT PARTICIPANTS

Based on the Budget
Committee's recommendation,

Mr. Mickelson moved that the Trustees authorize, effective July 9, 1985, through the President of the University of Wyoming, the negotiation of repayment schedules with Medical Student Contract Support Program participants. An amendment reflective of the negotiated repayment schedule shall be executed by both parties and made a part of the Contract. The amendment will require no (0.0) interest rate charges for the first eight (8) years of

repayment; commencing with the ninety-seventh month, and extending for an additional repayment period not to exceed twenty-four months, the interest charge shall be eight (8) percent annual percentage rate on the outstanding balance; if a default occurs any time during the repayment period, a two (2) percent annual percentage rate late charge shall be applied to the outstanding balance. The motion was seconded by Mr. Gillaspie, and it carried. Trustees Gillaspie, Hinckley, McCue, Mickelson, Rochelle, Smith, voted for the motion and Trustees Bussart, Schuster, Sawyer, and Updike voted against the motion.

EARLY RETIREMENT OPTIONS

The administration of the University of Wyoming, in consultation with the Faculty Senate and the Staff Council, has appointed an ad hoc committee for the purpose of investigating the options for early retirement programs at the University of Wyoming. Members of the committee are Donald F. Parker, Dean of the College of Commerce and Industry, Chairman; Rod Janney, Deputy to the Vice President for Finance; Donald A. Smith, Past President, Faculty Senate; and Duane L. Timmerman, Staff Council representative.

To assist the ad hoc committee, the University has engaged the services of Hewitt Associates, Denver, Colorado, a firm of independent actuaries and consultants in employee benefits, compensation, communication, and related human resource and financial matters.

Dean Parker, Chair of the ad hoc committee, led a discussion with the Trustees on the preliminary activities of the committee. The ad hoc committee will continue to explore the questions and hopes to make a recommendation to the Trustees in November, if an early retirement program is found to be feasible.

FORMALIZED EXIT INTERVIEW PROCESS FOR FACULTY

Action has been taken to remedy the concerns expressed earlier by the Trustees, and it is expected that statewide coverage of University athletic events will be greatly enhanced during the forthcoming seasons.

REPORT ON 1985
AUSTRALIA BOWL I

Dr. Cunningham reported on Australia Bowl I, the league football game between the University of Wyoming and the University of Texas at El Paso which is scheduled for December 7, 1985 at 7:00 p.m. in Melbourne, Australia. Being the first major college football game ever played in that country, it is expected

to be a major event in terms of cultural exchange and as an educational experience for participating student athletes. All expenses for travel and accommodations for the teams will be paid by the promoters of the contest, and the University will receive a game guarantee equal to the net proceeds originally anticipated from the game.

The event will be televised nationally in Australia via satellite.

NCAA SPECIAL CONVENTION REPORT

Dr. Cunningham presented a report to the Athletic

Committee on the proceedings of the National Collegiate Athletic Association Special Convention, held June 19-21, 1985 in New Orleans, Louisiana. Dr. Cunningham summarized briefly the following proposals which passed at the NCAA Special Convention.

Self Studies. Effective August 1, 1986, each member school is required to conduct a self-study of its athletic department at least once every five years.

Academic Reporting. Effective August 1, 1986, Division I schools must report the academic status of all incoming freshmen, as well as information on academic progress and graduation figures for both recruited student-athletes and the entire student body.

Tougher Penalties. Effective September 1, 1985, there will be a separation of rules violations into secondary and major categories, and tougher penalties will be imposed for the latter. Minimum penalties are established for major infractions, and additional sanctions dictated for repeat offenses. The minimum penalty for repeat violators in any sport--those guilty of major violations a second time in five or fewer years--includes a ban on football competition for two seasons and the prohibition of coaching activity for a similar period of time.

Coaches' Penalties. Effective immediately, sanctions against a coach apply even if he or she moves to another school.

Institutional Control of Athletic Budgets. Effective immediately, a school's athletic budget must be controlled by the institution, not the athletic department or a separate athletic board, and is subject to approval of the president.

Outside Audit. Effective immediately an outside audit of each school's athletic program is required annually.

Signed Affidavits. Also approved was a resolution which requires that student-athletes and coaches sign one-time-only affidavits disclosing financial assistance and athletically related benefits being received.

Many of the changes mandated by the NCAA were already in place at the University of Wyoming.
