

# Club News

## Two Great Club Events

In the last month, UARC held two great club events. On October 31<sup>st</sup>, we participated for the first time in the **Ghost Towns on the Air** Wyoming event. Our event callsign for Albany County was W7E (the E is the 5<sup>th</sup> letter of the alphabet corresponding to the number 5 for our license plates). Chris (W7JR), Liam (KK7SUU), and Blake (KK7QHS) drove out to a patch of state land in Bosler. We set up a camper trailer for shelter and two antenna masts: 20 meter monoband EFHW, 15 meter EFHW, later switching to 40 meter. 20 meters was by far the most successful. The 40 meter antennas didn't seem to get out for us that night, so trouble shooting is in the future. The rigs were two Icom 7300s and Chris's new band pass filters. Overall, UARC put up some respectable numbers!

On November 17<sup>th</sup>, UARC hosted a club **Parks on the Air** event at the Territorial Prison. For this event, we pulled out the two club Kenwood rigs to get them some use. A 2 meter station was set up with 20 watts on a copper pipe J-Pole that Everett (KK7QHT) made. Additionally, Doug (N6UA) brought a satellite setup and Ben (KF7UFF) set up a 15 meter CW station with his Yeasu rig. That's right, 5 stations operating simultaneously! Together with about 70 minutes of operation, we posted a respectable 73 contacts. It was especially exciting to see our two youngest HAMs operating the FM station on their own. Thank you to the club members that reached out to them. In total, we had 12 attendees!

- 10 meter SSB, 9 contacts
- 15 meter CW, 26 contacts
- 20 meter SSB, 30 contacts
