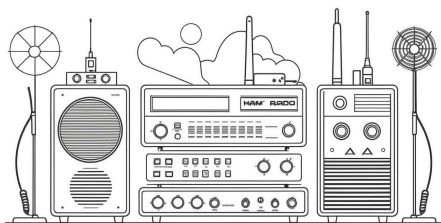

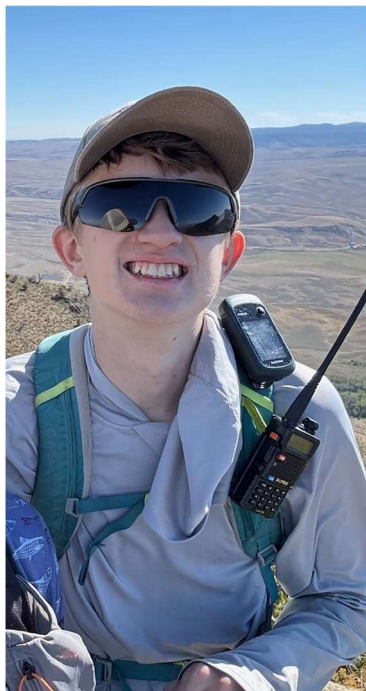

With us all being in Scout Troop 137, our radio skills have proven quite useful in the back country. My older son, Liam (KK7SUU), saw how much fun we were having and then got his license.
