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Wyoming Family Voices



"His service provider will not be able to program for him, and my son will not be able to buy services with such a drastic cut."

"There will not be enough money in his budget to live here. I would be forced to put my brother in a nursing home, or group home."

"He would have to quit his 15 hour a week job as employment support staff funds would now be needed for day services as well."

"He would have to have less staff support during his unpredictable seizure activity **putting his life in danger**."

Direct Service Professional Voices

"The person I serve will lose crucial funding for the support she needs to be productive, functional, and happy."

"The majority of individuals who receive services will have their health and safety put at risk."

"It will be difficult to maintain staff in our agency."

"It will put my small Provider company out of business. I have worked my whole life to own my own business."
