

Foundations in Assistive Technology

In *Foundations in Assistive Technology*, participants will:

- Be introduced to the field of assistive technology (AT)
- Develop a working definition of AT
- Learn about a wide range of AT devices that can benefit individuals across the lifespan
- Learn about the legal mandates for schools and universities to provide technology devices and services for students with disabilities in educational and employment settings
- Use a case study approach to examine AT practice to increase individuals participation in their daily activities, school, and employment
- Learn about an AT assessment and how it can be used to foster the implementation of AT

- DVR counselors
- College and university support staff
- Any individual interested in AT
- Transition counselors
