### Partnership Updates

## WSUP Presents Ellbogen Transition Program Project to Wyoming State Board of Education

On Thursday August 4, WSUP Director Leslie Rush, along with Kristy Palmer and Nicholas Jesse, presented data on workforce/college readiness transition programs offered at different schools around Wyoming to the Wyoming State Board of Education. The project is being funded by the Ellbogen Foundation and its primary goal is to establish a database that includes program names, where they are located, goals of the program, and other specific categories related to the courses. The data is being compiled into a web tool called **Batch Geo** which will map the data into an at-a-glance look using location information.



## High Altitude Pathways Program

The University of Wyoming College of Education and the UW Trustees Education Initiative were awarded a \$1.2 million grant to improve postsecondary enrollment and completion among rural students. This grant was awarded by the U.S. Department of Education's Rural Postsecondary and Economic Development Program.

**UW will collaborate with College for Every Student (CFES) Brilliant Pathways** to develop the UW High Altitude pathway program to provide high school-aged students and local community leaders with tools to improve enrollment and graduation rates among Wyoming's rural students.




## Wyoming Teacher Mentor Corps


