High Altitude Pathways

The University of Wyoming College of Education and Trustees Education Initiative (TEI) was awarded a three-year grant from the U.S. Department of Education to support rural high school students' enrollment and persistence in post-secondary education. The grant's funding cycle began on October 1, 2022 and runs through September 20, 2025. 
