Master Educator Competency Program


The University of Wyoming College of Education recently launched the [**Master Educator Competency Program \(MECP\)**](#), which aims to address teacher attrition while developing in-depth support systems across Wyoming's K-12 communities. The program is currently being funded by the University of Wyoming College of Education with grant funding from the Daniels Fund. This endeavor will also engage with WSUP to seek collaboration between College of Education and the Partnership.

Wallop Foundation Catalog Updates

The Wallop K-12 Social Studies Catalog has added content in two exciting areas. First, in partnership with the School of Energy Resources there are fourteen new multimedia content packages focusing on Wyoming's energy and extractive industries with topics ranging from oil and gas to trona, carbon capture and storage, and wind power. The photo to the right depicts the counties and the Wind River Reservation utilizing the content in the catalog.




Saddle Up

The University of Wyoming College of Education hosted 109 total incoming freshman during the inaugural Saddle Up program back in August. **Saddle Up** is a week-long, college preparation program that was established to provide in-depth support to incoming students, while improving the student experience by setting a clear path to graduation. During their time, new students experienced a top-to-bottom breakdown of college life at UW and participated in a week of skill-building and study sessions.




College of Education Welcome Back BBQ
