
October 2023 | The Latest Updates from WSUP

Wyoming Principal Mentor Certification Program

On October 6th and 7th, a kick-off meeting was held in Laramie for the year-long Wyoming Principal Mentor Certification Program (WPMC). Fourteen educational leaders from around the state were selected to participate in this program. The participants represent nine school districts from around the state. This program is designed to provide a cohort of Wyoming principals with National Mentor Training and Certification through the National Association of Elementary School Principals (NAESP) and is supplemented with additional cohort-based learning by the College of Education utilizing both in-person and online formats.

School districts represented include: ACSD1, BHCSD2, FCSD21, FCSD24, FCSD38, LCSD1, PCSD1, PCSD6, and SCSD2.


WSUP Best Practices Presentation

Education Community Updates




WTMC Graduation

On September 27, 16 Wyoming Teacher-Leaders were recognized as College of Education Mentor Fellows for completing the Wyoming Teacher Mentor Corps training. Over the past 15 months they developed their mentoring skills and learned about assessing teaching and learning, assertive communication, providing meaningful feedback, and finding & maintaining content area. The final project for the Mentor Fellows was to identify a professional challenge, address the problem in their professional practice, then share how their practice improved the problem. They then shared their findings with other education leaders from around the state. Senator John Barrasso also offered a congratulatory message to graduates at the ceremony.

Supporting Teachers in Rural cOmmunities for the Next Generation (STEM STRONG)




