
Vaccination Hesitancy: A Common Trend In Powell, Wyoming

Background

- Park county has a population of about 30,000 people.
- Vaccination rate of 36% in the county is not reflective of Powell, WY.
- Vaccination hesitancy is an outspoken topic amongst patients and members of the healthcare community.

Literature Review

- While individuals engage in complex decision-making models to reach desired outcomes, not all members of a given population will reach acceptance at the same rate or by the same decision-making processes.
- Identifying barriers to vaccination acceptance and other appropriate health interventions is necessary to deploy a safe and trusted vaccination successfully.
- Patient's questions were used to generate an educational pamphlet that could hopefully provide answers and educate the population in the topic.
