

Background

How is the opioid epidemic affecting high school students in the United States?

- In 2015, 276,000 adolescents were current nonmedical users of pain reliever.¹
- In 2017, one in four adolescents in the United States have misused a prescription opioid at least once in their life, and nearly one in four high school students in the United States were exposed to opioids, medically or non-medically.²

How is the opioid epidemic affecting High School **Students in Wyoming?**

• In a study done by the Wyoming Survey and Analysis Center in 2016, 3% of 10th through 12th graders self reported misusing an opioid prescription medication in the last 30 days.³

Hypothesis

Screening high school students using a medication safety survey will help gauge teenage opioid literacy and show need for early intervention and education in Hot Springs County, Wyoming.

Literature Review

- is seldom studied.
- In the 2021 Journal of Pediatric Pharmacology and Therapeutics, the **Adolescent Opioid Safety and Learning** (AOSL) Scale was developed.
- Four factors emerged necessary to use the **AOSL. Surveys must assess:**
 - Likelihood to Misuse Opioids

 - Opioid Learning Interest Opioid Misuse Behavior • Opioid Harm
- The AOSL framework is vital to defining and measuring adolescents' knowledge of and preferences for opioid safety, current misuse, and storage practice of opioids.


