In response, the Wyoming Center on Aging (WyCOA) is offering a Dementia Care Certificate for healthcare professionals working with individuals with dementia. The certificate is an online self-paced program designed to fit within the healthcare professional's busy schedule. The modules are previously recorded WyCOA workshops, online trainings, and webinars from experts in their field. Further, modules developed by the Health Resources and Services Administration are included to provide a standardized dementia foundation.

The WyCOA Dementia Care Certificate is a convenient, easily assessable program that recognizes individuals for learning quality dementia care practices and knowledge.

Funding from the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) will allow the certificate to be offered free of charge for those who complete certificate requirements June 30th, 2025.
