Each program will feature a panel presentation by regional experts in the field of dementia care and will provide practical guidance in accessing local professional help. There will be ample time for attendees to participate with their questions and comments. Vendor space is available; information may be obtained by contacting WYCOA directly. *There is no charge to attend any of these sessions, but lunch will be served at each location so pre-registration is strongly encouraged.*

This three-part series is part of the ongoing effort of Wyoming Dementia Together, a regional, multi-state team of experienced dementia care professionals operating under WYCOA and dedicated to supporting those who are caring for a person with dementia. The group was organized three years ago and has been offering free, bi-weekly Zoom programming in areas such as utilizing community resources, building and strengthening support networks, learning how to manage stress and other challenging situations.
