



Assisted Living

Assisted living is for people who need help with daily care, but not as much help as a nursing home

provides.









Memory Care

Provides intensive, specialized care for people with memory issues within the assisted living facility.









Assisted Living: Who?

- Designed for people with various levels of medical and personal care needs
- Living spaces: rooms, apartments, shared quarters
- Home-like setting to promote resident's independence







Assisted Living: Services

- You live in your own space with room to entertain and do your own activities.
- These services are included:
 - Meal Preparation
 - Personal Care
 - Cleaning Services
 - Transportation
 - Organized Recreational Activities









Memory Care: Who?

Designed for people living in an assisted living facility who benefit from dementia-specific activities tailored to the unique cognitive needs of people with dementia.





Memory Care: When?

These are five circumstances that can indicate that a loved one needs memory care:

- Changes in behavior
- Confusion and disorientation that imperils physical safety
- A decline in physical health related to dementia
- Caregiver's decline in health
- Incontinence







Memory Care: Services

What care is provided?

Care provided in assisted living facilities



- 24-hour Care
- Specialized Staff
- Memory-enhancing Activities and Therapies
- Safe Environments





Skilled Nursing Facility




Skilled nursing facilities typically provide acute care supervised by a physician.

- Short-Term Rehabilitation
- Long-Term Care
- Secure Unit/Memory Care









Skilled Nursing Facility: Who?

Short-Term Rehabilitation

Patients qualify when the following are met:

- they require skilled rehabilitative services
- at a frequency and intensity of at least 5 days per week
- at least 60 minutes per day







Skilled Nursing Facility: Services

Short-Term Rehabilitation

What services are provided?

- Physical Therapy to increase mobility
- Occupational Therapy to help with daily living activities
- Social Interaction and Spiritual Support
- Balanced Diet and Nutrition Plan







Skilled Nursing Facility: Who?

Long-Term Care

Recommended for patients with:

- Dementia, Alzheimer's disease, or other cognitive disorders
- Parkinson's Disease and other neurological conditions
- Chronic conditions limiting mobility and ability to live independently
- Need to receive skilled nursing care 24 hours/day







Skilled Nursing Facility: Services

Long-Term Care

What services are provided?

- Serves as a transition between hospital and permanent residence
- Provides 24-hour care, including access to licensed medical care
- Aids with activities, i.e., bathing, eating and taking medications







Skilled Nursing Facility: Who?

Memory Care

Recommended for Patients who:

- have Alzheimer's and other related dementias
- need 24-hour care
- benefit from specialized care treating dementia related symptoms







Skilled Nursing Facility: Services

Memory Care

What services are provided?


- Specialized staff provides memory-enhancing activities and therapies
- Safe environments
- assistance with activities of daily living
- 24-hour Care









Home Health Care

- Helps older adults live independently as long as possible in their home.
- Services include:
 - Occupational Therapy
 - Physical Therapy
 - Speech Therapy
 - Skilled Nursing
 - Medical Social Services
 - Homemaker/Basic Assistance





Hospice Care



What is it?

- Care at the end of life
- Focuses on care, comfort and quality of life
- Provided at home or in a facility
- Services are available to patients and their
 - families
- Insurance coverage?





Palliative Care



What is it?

- Care provided for people living with a serious illness.
- Patients receive medical care for their symptoms along with treatment to cure their illness.
- Services provided for patients and their families.





Respite Care



What is it?

- Care provides short-term relieve for caregivers.
- Few hours up to several days or weeks.
- Care provided at
 - home
 - healthcare facility
 - adult care center


