

## **Assisted Living**

Skilled Nursing





## Assisted Living

Assisted living is for people who need help with daily care, but not as much help as a nursing home provides.



## Memory Care



Provides intensive, specialized care for people with memory issues within the assisted living facility.





## **Skilled Nursing Facility**

Skilled nursing facilities typically provide acute care supervised by a physician.



## Memory Care



Provides intensive, specialized care for people with memory issues within the skilled nursing facility.


