

## 2018 WYNDD Partners Meeting Participant Survey Results

#### What did you find LEAST VALUABLE about this meeting?

- No suggestions.

- Discussions about funding. As a biologist, I do not deal directly with funding and money transfers, so this line of discussion was above my pay-grade.
- Small group discussions in the afternoon.
- The last afternoon breakout group, but partly because there was no topic that relates directly to my areas of main interest
- I wish the discussion of data needs would've been more focused/directed. It seemed like we wondered off track with what WYNDD can provide.
- The breakout sessions left me with decisions about what discussions I didn't want to have and that wasn't ideal. Maybe taking away the discussion about "what is important in the future"

would provide some of the time needed to accommodate more discussion as a group of what is happening now in the various areas? By necessity, the group must focus on what is happening now. Sure, the future matters, but the partner meetings are annually occurring now and my most pressing need is for the current year.

- The proportion of break time to activity/discussion time seemed a bit high.
- Some of the in-depth database discussion in a large group was maybe not the most effective format.

- Coordination with other states.

- I'm really excited about the online species accounts. It would be great to hear an update on these!
- Funding diversification; core products and approaches to maximizing benefit of these products
- I'd like to see more details presented about some of the research projects and research of methodologies.
- If there is going to be any discussion of future projects, lets have a list of those and leave it there? Sure others are interested in a variety of things, but if you polled folks you'd have some themes pop out and we could describe what we're doing now to address those leaving room for more discussion of how to expand those ongoing efforts, etc. Lastly, if what we need to do is focus as partners of core functions of the WYNDD, then lets come prepared to focus on that aspect of the organization and less on project work.
- Work session interacting with the web interface of data explorer. Presentation was good that described it, but would like a chance to interact and ask questions.
- More on data standardization
- Explanation of habitat modeling efforts and update on Ute ladies tresses species review process.
- More work with climate variables and tracking
- WYNDD role or potential role in serving as authority got species listing changes for Wyoming (i.e., use of species list for listings).

- I think it would've been helpful to have fewer small group discussions and try to open them up to everyone. I for one, would've liked to hear the discussion of several of them. When providing the WYNDD overview info, I'd like it clarified what data you're in charge of serving vs. USFWS, WGFD, etc.
- See "topics" answer for some suggestion on format. Opportunity to see more of the new database will be useful in the coming year. Suggestions of how data can be entered most efficiently by other contributors. Provide the best ways in which we can all describe the database and its various parts as valuable? Not for the purpose of putting words in anyone's mouth, but because you have surely had tough discussions with administrators and legislators where some have gone better than others... What were some of the items that you shared that resonated with the different groups and why? In sharing what you've heard on that front, you can let us know where and why you've had some successes or failures in those discussions. That will in turn, help all the partners to share equivalent messages that are most likely to be well received, and ultimately resonate with the broader audience as time goes on. It will also continue to shape and refine the role or future of the WYNDD through that ongoing discussion.
